INTRODUCTION

The annual report on the work of SOLIDARNA - Foundation for Human Rights and Solidarity for 2020 was prepared by the Foundation's manager Marina Škrabalo with Ivan Blažević, Secretary of the Foundation, in cooperation with Petra Mađerčić, expert associate for donation programs and Azra Ayyash, program assistant. The annual report was discussed and adopted by the SOLIDARNA Foundation Board.

The strategic plan of SOLIDARNA is formed in three-year cycles in accordance with the opportunities for action and current possibilities. From 2020 to the end of 2023, the SOLIDARNA Foundation focused its activities on four strategic goals: (1) providing effective and flexible support to active citizens and human rights defenders, (2) developing a culture of solidarity, and philanthropy for human rights through cross-sectoral cooperation and citizen mobilization, (3) stability and continuity of the organization's activities and (4) increase of the Foundation's resources.

Although we started the first two months of 2020 strategically, very quickly we faced new challenges that required certain changes and adjustments in our work, and the scope of work increased significantly. The beginning of 2020 was marked by the COVID-19 pandemic, with which we are still fighting a year later, and which changed our familiar everyday life overnight. For us, this meant that we had to adapt quickly to online work and that we were ready to actively financially and organizationally support associations and volunteer groups that help citizens in crisis and provide social services in the community. The pandemic was accompanied by huge changes in the organization of social life and the economy and an increase in poverty, to which the Foundation responded with a wide range of activities aimed at strengthening social solidarity.

In addition to the pandemic, our country was also affected by earthquakes: the City of Zagreb on March 22, and nine months later, on December 29, Petrinja and other cities and towns

throughout Sisak-Moslavina and in the peripheral areas of neighboring counties. Thanks to the previous experience in organizing emergency donor actions and our rich cooperation network, the SOLIDARNA Foundation was able to react quickly and efficiently even in times of crisis. With the support and trust of five young women from Zagreb with a Dutch address involved in the Zagreb Earthquake Relief initiative, which entrusted us with part of the donations collected immediately after the earthquake, in mid-April we launched the 5.5 Crisis Support Fund for Socially Vulnerable Households and were able to pay for emergency repairs and rents by mid-June.

Fund 5.5 was reactivated on December 29 after the earthquakes that hit Petrinja and Sisak-Moslavina County. Thanks to donations from citizens and companies across Croatia and the world in just two days, we managed to raise 5.5 million kunas and immediately begin implementing a comprehensive humanitarian program "In solidarity with Petrinja and SMŽ".

Despite the crisis and working conditions, the Foundation continued the activities of existing programs, as planned at the end of 2019. In March 2021 started the implementation of the Active Citizenship Fund program, donated by the Kingdom of Norway and the European Economic Area, within which for the next five years we act as an implementing partner in a consortium led by the Slagalica Foundation from Osijek, in cooperation with SMART from Rijeka and the Slovenian organization CNVOS from Ljubljana.

In its advocacy work, SOLIDARNA continues to work with collaborating organizations to protect women's human rights and fight against gender-based violence, which was especially evident during this first year of existence and activities of the #spasime Fund for Crisis Support to Victims of Domestic and Sexual Violence. Together with the #spasime initiative and the Reproductive Justice Platform, in January 2020 we organized the "Support a Police Officer" campaign to help an abused police officer who reported an abuser to cover court costs of 10,000 kunas. Due to the situation with the coronavirus pandemic and epidemiological measures that did not allow mass gatherings for most of the year, the public actions we organized in previous years in 2020 were absent, but we co-organized and participated in public appearances and discussions online, consultations with government institutions and actively supported actions and work of collaborating organizations.

The SOLIDARNA Foundation can boast of revenue growth in the previous year as well, which is an indicator of SOLIDARNA's successful positioning as a reliable partner to the public and business sector and citizens. We are especially grateful to all our donors and the public for expressing their trust in our Foundation as a transparent and secure channel for humanitarian donations after the devastating earthquakes in Petrinja.

The year behind us has shaken society from its foundations, and solidarity in practice - through philanthropic action and volunteering - has proven to be life-saving in times of crisis. This difficult year has brought us confirmation that the mission of our Foundation is needed by our society

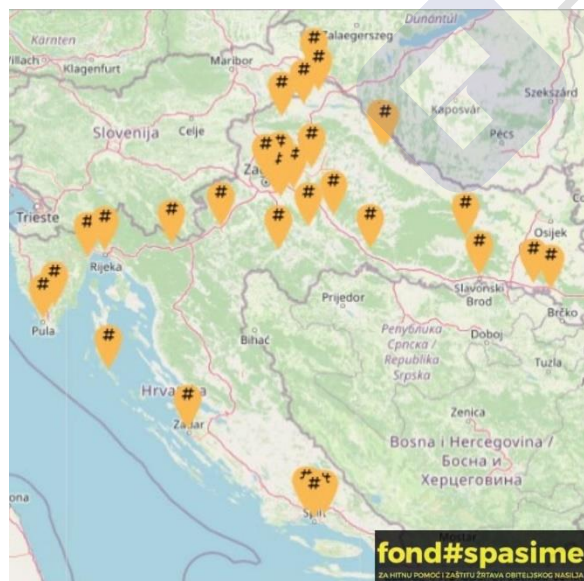
and that despite all the adversity, we have reason to be optimistic - with our new slogan **#Solidarity is #NewNormal!**

PROGRAM ACHIEVEMENTS IN 2020

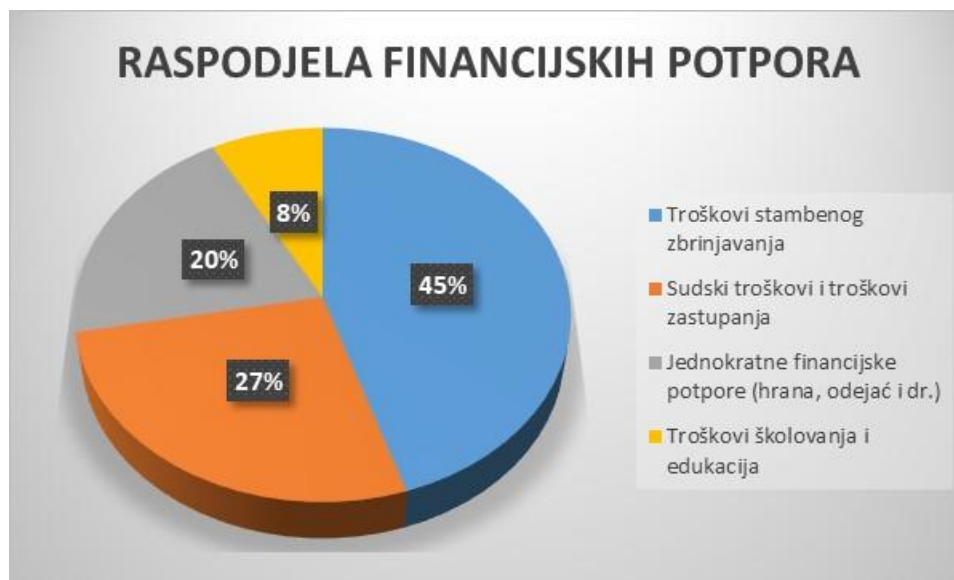
Fond #SPASIME

In cooperation with the #SPASIME Initiative, the SOLIDARNA Foundation established the #spasime Fund in 2019 with the aim of emergency assistance and protection of victims of domestic, partner, and sexual violence. The basic purpose of the Fund is to provide concrete and interventional assistance to victims in terms of economic, legal, psychological, medical, and housing assistance. Namely, without sufficient financial and other resources, victims often remain in violent relationships and the environment. The goal of the SOLIDARNA Foundation is, through the activities of the Fund, to enable victims a new life without violence.

Beneficiaries of the #spasime Fund are entitled to assistance in financing legal and medical expenses, but also payment of psychotherapy costs, housing costs, basic needs, additional education costs for inclusion in the work system, costs of telephone calls and transportation to access counseling, purchase allowance personal belongings not provided by the shelter, the cost of repairs to life-threatening items incurred in cases of violence, the cost of reconstructive surgery, home help and the cost of the funeral of the murdered victim. In addition to these new costs covered by the Fund, there are urgent costs: a one-time relocation fee within Croatia if the victim has to leave their community to avoid the threat of violence and a maximum stay of 7 days if the shelters are full or unavailable.



During 2020, the #spasime Fund provided direct financial support to 49 women, most of whom have children, enabling them to either leave the violent environment and/or gain/maintain independence after leaving the violent environment. A total of HRK 253,741.51 was spent on financial support, of which the most (45%) on housing costs, followed by court costs and representation costs (27%), followed by one-time financial support to beneficiaries for living expenses in the form of food, clothing and specific user need (20%). The least funds (8%) were spent on the costs of schooling and education.



Since returning to the labor market after leaving a violent environment is the foundation for achieving and maintaining the independence for women who have survived violence and left the violent environment, the #spasime Fund and the SOLIDARNA Foundation have focused their attention and energy on advocacy for change over the past year at the institutional level in the context of creating a solitary work environment with women victims of domestic and partner violence. As a contribution to the global campaign "16 days of activism against violence against women", with the #spasime Fund and HR PSOR, with the support of the European Parliament in Croatia, a round table "Solidarity work environment with women victims of partner and domestic violence" was organized. The round table underlined the basic needs of victims of gender-based violence in the workplace and labor market, which relate to safety and quality of jobs but also long-term progress, financial support for crisis costs (from lawyers, through rent to treatment), affordable and professional psychological support.

Based on the conclusions of the round table, representatives of the SOLIDARNA Foundation and the head of the #spasime Fund met with the Minister of Labor, Pensions, Family and Social Policy Josip Aladrović and his associates from the Ministry of Social Welfare and EU Funds Management. It was emphasized at the meeting that for overcoming the vicious circle of unfinished reforms, and thus for overcoming our fellow citizens from the circle of marginalization, violence, and poverty, the key (1) real political will is manifested in the adoption of key strategic documents and the creation of an efficient social contracting system, (2) the real openness of government to the "field" experience and knowledge accumulated in civil society, and (3) the ability to manage money, people, and services so that different resources are connected and coordinated, rather than wasted.

The importance of the #spasime Fund's activities was recognized by both institutions and the general public, and in mid-2020 the Fund signed a collaboration agreement with New York jazz

singer and composer of Croatian origin Than Alex, according to which one dollar from each sold copy of her album "She " is donated to the Fund for Assistance to Women of Domestic and Partner Violence and their Children.

In 2020, the donor campaign for the #SPASIME Fund received the world's largest and most important communication award, the Golden World Awards 2020, in the Community Engagement category, which was awarded to partner PR agency MediaVal, which co-designed and conducted the campaign on a pro bono basis. It is an award given by IPRA (International Public Relations Association), a leading global network of public relations professionals founded in 1955. Media Val and the #spasime Fund found themselves in the company of prominent communication ventures from the USA, Japan, the United Kingdom, Spain, Russia, the United Arab Emirates, and other countries.

5.5 Earthquake Crisis Support Fund (Zagreb Earthquake)

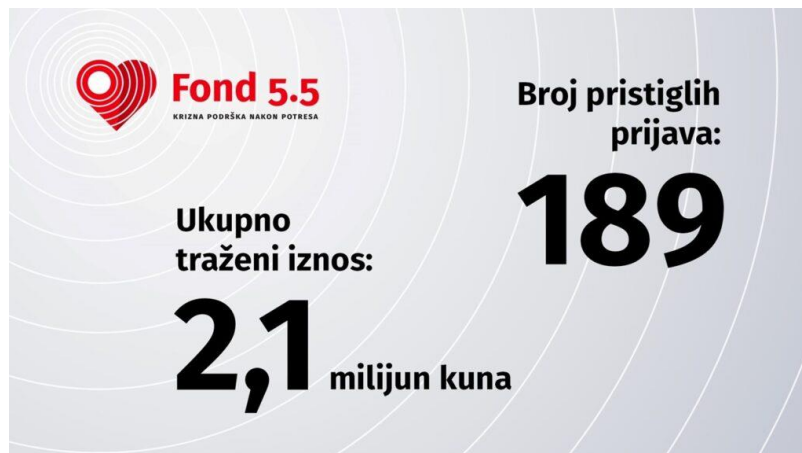
On March 23, the city of Zagreb was hit by a devastating earthquake measuring 5.5 on the Richter scale. On the same day, five young women from Zagreb with a Dutch address gathered in the Zagreb Earthquake Relief initiative, launched a crowdfunding campaign during which, with the help of more than four thousand donors, they collected as much as 173 thousand euros or about 1.3 million kunas. Of the total amount raised, their initiative donated part of the funds to Peter's Hospital for the purchase of medical equipment, while with the rest of the funds, in cooperation with the SOLIDARNA Foundation, Fund 5.5 was established for crisis support to socially vulnerable households.

For decisions on the criteria and allocation of financial support to our fellow citizens, the SOLIDARNA Foundation established the Foundation Council of Fund 5.5, whose members were: prof.dr.sc. Marina Ajduković from the Faculty of Law in Zagreb, architect doc.dr.sc. Zrinka Paladino, Sara Juričić, and Jana Zane as representatives of the Zagreb Earthquake Relief initiative and Ivan Blažević as a representative of SOLIDARNA.

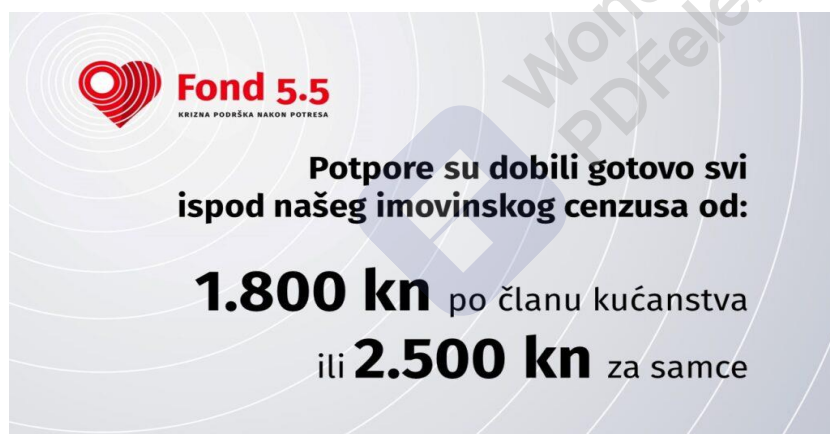
Public call for support from Fund 5.5. was open from 15 to 29 April 2020 and a total of 189 Zagreb households applied. The Fund's Foundation Council reviewed all valid applications and ranked them following the criteria set out in the Ordinance on the allocation of financial support from the Fund 5.5. Priority for the allocation of funds was given to socially disadvantaged households - those with an average monthly income of less than HRK 1,800.00 per household member, or HRK 2,500.00 for single households - especially families with children, and households that make up, or include, the elderly or persons with disabilities or chronic illnesses.

From Fund 5.5. a total of 48 grants were granted to the most socially vulnerable households in the total available amount of HRK 706,400.00, and the average value of aid per household was HRK 14,716.00. 41 households received grants to repair material damage, while seven households received grants to rent an apartment. A total of 132 people live in the 48 households that received financial support, of which 37 children, 18 people with disabilities, and 21 people with chronic or severe illness. Almost all applicants with a monthly income below the property

threshold specified in the Fund's Regulations, of HRK 1,800.00 per household member, were supported from Fund 5.5.



Based on the received applications, the Fund's Foundation Council marked a total of 79 households with a monthly income of up to HRK 2,250.00 per household member as the most socially vulnerable. To cover all the needs of all these households, 1.1 million kunas are needed. Because HRK 706,400.00 has already been allocated from Fund 5.5 for 48 households, an additional HRK 393,600.00 was needed to cover another 31 households that meet all the criteria.



At that moment, Zagrebačka brewery contacted us with a wish to include Fund 5.5 in its "Good People" campaign, and they donated HRK 250,000.00 for the victims of the earthquake. In addition, on the occasion of the French national holiday on July 14, Gaël Veyssiere, the Ambassador of the French Republic to the Republic of Croatia organized a charity dinner intending to raise funds for the 5.5 Crisis Support Fund after the earthquake.

Apart from the fact that the French Embassy in Croatia donated € 3,000, they invited French-Croatian companies to contribute to the fund. MZLZ, Decathlon Croatia, Suez, Safege, Citroen,

Peugeot, AGS, Mazars, Atos Croatia, Bina Istra, Servier, Colas, and IPSOS donated an additional HRK 58,660.

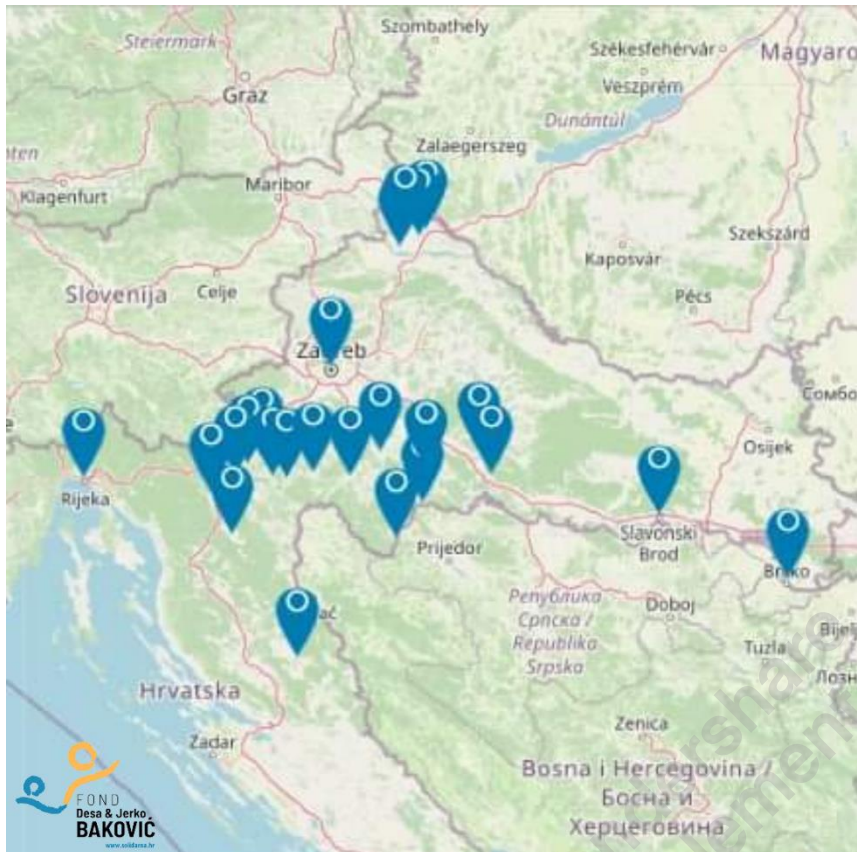
In addition to all monetary donations, the company IKEA donated furniture worth € 50,000 to citizens whose furniture was damaged in the earthquake. With additional donations, we were able to assist another 28 families who were on our reserve list.



The earthquake that hit Zagreb during the first wave of the coronavirus pandemic brought to the surface a lot of good. Once again, we realized that solidarity is the foundation of every mature and healthy society, and donations from companies, individuals, and individuals for the victims showed how much we can work together. SOLIDARNA is grateful for the trust shown by the citizens, as well as the donors who marked our work as transparent and chose us as associates. We are grateful for every kuna that ended up in the hands of the needy to make it at least a little easier for them to cope with the aftermath of the earthquake.

Desa & Jerko Baković Fund

The Desa & Jerko Baković Fund was established in April 2018 thanks to a generous donation from deceased Desa Baković for HRK 600,000. Desa Baković (1917-2019) was the wife of Jerko Baković (1916-2010), a well-known Zagreb anti-fascist and the brother of two anti-fascists, Zdenka and Rajka Baković. The couple helped the needy in the area of Kordun and Banija during the war. Seeing the horrors of the war, their long-term wish was to help children and young people, especially in the area of the mentioned places, but also Lika and Gorski Kotar. Ms. Desa Baković dedicated her old age to respecting the wishes of her late husband Jerko, thus creating the Fund "Desa and Jerko Baković" which provides financial, material, and professional support to the education of poor children and youth, primarily primary and secondary school age.



In December 2020, on the eve of the holidays and to celebrate five years of its operation, the SOLIDARNA Foundation launched a fundraising campaign to ensure the long-term sustainability of the Desa & Jerko Baković Fund. The campaign was launched on December 6 and lasted until December 18 and ended with a donor dinner.

As the donor dinner was held during the coronavirus pandemic and restrictive measures that primarily relate to social distance and the ban on gatherings, it was necessary to use creative solutions in planning and organizing it. The SOLIDARNA Foundation team overcame all obstacles by moving the dinner to the online sphere and providing donors with an unforgettable experience while respecting all epidemiological measures.

The realization of the online donor dinner, as well as the long-term sustainability of the Desa & Jerko Baković Fund, whose activities create a future of equal opportunities for children and youth of lower-income status from most rural parts of the Republic of Croatia, was made possible by 24 volunteers who invested their time and effort, and Zagreb restaurants Ginger Sushi, Zagreb Cultural Circle - Kod Draška and Layali Lebanese Restaurant who donated meal preparation to the Foundation. For the accompanying entertainment program without no donor dinner would be complete, the renowned names of the Zagreb radio and dance floors donated their creative energy, time, and experience; Ivona Kovačević, Čedo Prodanović, Boris Jokić, and Branimir Pofuk, who created original playlists especially for this occasion, which were sent to the supporters of the campaign. The availability of playlists, not only for donors within the Republic of Croatia but also around the world, was made possible by the publishing house Aquarius Records, whose Anđelko Preradović donated his time and knowledge and posted playlists on streaming services YouTube, Spotify, and Deezer. For the promotion of the campaign on social networks, the digital creative agency iZone donated its knowledge, experience and time, which designed the visual identity of the campaign itself, but also invested significant financial resources for their promotion. We also had great support from our media partner Yammatt FM, which hosted a promotional donor dinner jingle for free. The campaign raised a total of HRK 81,415.00, of which the total costs amounted to HRK 10,818.00 (HRK 18,104.00 for groceries used to prepare meals in restaurants, and HRK 714.00 for the promotion of posts on Facebook). The realized total profit for the Desa & Jerko Baković Fund amounts to HRK 70,597.00, of which HRK 31,415.00 is direct donations from 130 private persons,

supporters of the Desa & Jerko Baković Fund, 2 legal entities, and 3 companies (Neutrino, Dada & Rocco, Signal Media) which participated in a birthday dinner. The remaining amount collected came from legal entities that did not participate in the donor dinner but assessed the support of the Fund's activities as a priority for building a solidarity society. Among them, the company iZone with a donation of HRK 20,000.00, the company Colliers International with a donation of HRK 20,000.00, and Erste Bank with a donation of HRK 10,000.00 stood out.

The total profit generated by the campaign held on the occasion of the fifth birthday of the SOLIDARNA Foundation in the amount of HRK 70,597.00 covers 47% of the total annual financial needs of the scholars of the Desa & Jerko Baković Fund.

Active Citizens Fund in Croatia

Under the leadership of the Slagalica Foundation from Osijek and in cooperation with SMART from Rijeka and the Slovenian umbrella organization CNVOS from Ljubljana, SOLIDARNA started in 2020 the implementation of the Fund for Active Citizens in Croatia, a donor program of the Kingdom of Norway and the European Economic Area based on values such as respect for human dignity, freedom, democracy, equality, the rule of law. These values fully correspond to the mission and priorities of our Foundation. For the implementation of the program in Croatia by the end of 2024 in grants have been provided EUR 8.5 million. The consortium that manages the Fund won the trust in an international public tender, which is a recognition of local philanthropy in Croatia.

Priority areas of support for the Active Citizenship Fund are 1) democracy, active citizenship, good governance and transparency, 2) human rights and equal treatment through prevention of discrimination based on race or ethnic origin, religion or belief, gender, disability, age, sexual orientation or gender identity, 3) social justice and social inclusion of vulnerable groups, 4) gender equality and prevention of gender-based violence, and 5) environment and climate change. The purpose of the Active Citizens Fund is to strengthen cooperation between organizations from Croatia and donor countries of the Program and to improve regional cooperation in the civil society sector.

The program was publicly presented on March 12 in Osijek, and in addition to representatives of the civil sector, the conference was also attended by the Ambassador of the Kingdom of Norway to Croatia Haakon Blankenborg and the Deputy Mayor of Osijek Žana Gamoš. Despite the pandemic last year, the Fund successfully issued as many as three public calls for financial support - for small projects, sector innovation projects and ad hoc action projects, and proved that effective donor support to civil society organizations is possible even in crisis conditions.

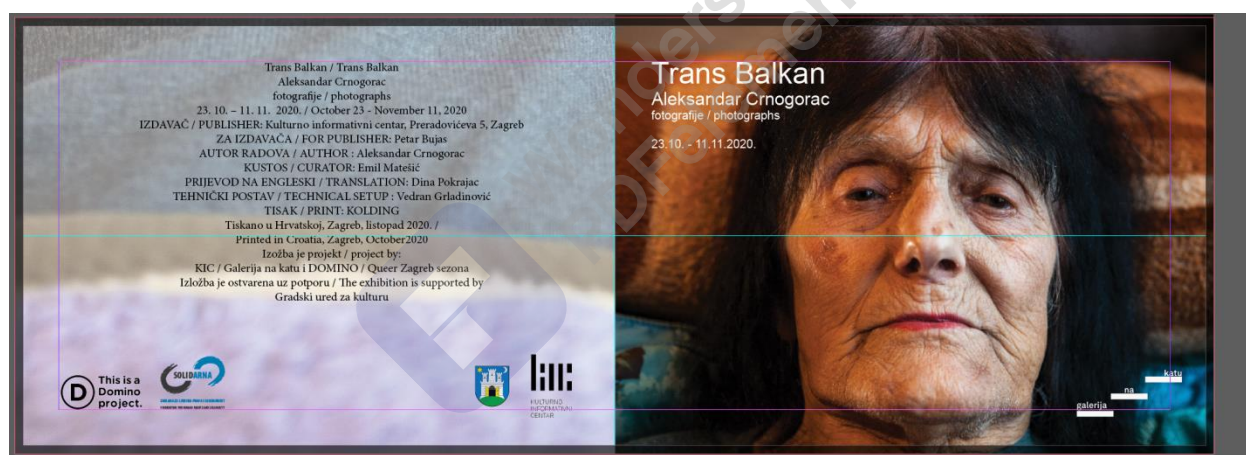
The engagement within the consortium entrusted with the management of this Fund has strategically improved SOLIDARNA, which within the Active Citizens Fund acts as a member responsible for ad hoc funding and building advocacy and organizational capacity of civic initiatives across the country. The main purpose of the Call for Ad Hoc Action Projects is to support civil society organizations and civic initiatives in situations that require an urgent

response, either in the face of immediate challenges and threats (for example, pressures on civic space and hate speech) or immediate opportunities to influence public opinion and political processes through various forms of citizen participation and public action, including campaigns, advocacy, legal, communication or others. In 2020, SOLIDARNA held information workshops on 8 and 15 July: a workshop for filling in the application form and budget form for all interested applicants regularly administered the process of processing project applications and the implementation of contracted projects, with mentorship and supervision of the Puzzle Foundation.

Programme "Culture in the Community"

The "Culture in the Community" program was launched by the SOLIDARNA Foundation in 2016 to create new opportunities for socially engaged artistic work of already recognized authors, as well as for the affirmation of young and non-established authors who interestingly approach human rights issues. Support for the "Culture in the Community" program focuses on cultural creativity that promotes the values of human rights and solidarity.

Exhibition TransBalkan



Through the program "Culture in the Community", the SOLIDARNA Foundation supported the documentary photographic project Trans Balkan, which deals with the transgender community of the Balkan region - the southeastern part of Europe. The exhibition was realized in cooperation with the Cultural Information Center and the Domino Association in the Upstairs Gallery as part of the Queer Zagreb season of the association. The opening took place on 23.10. 2020, and the exhibition could be viewed until 11.11.2020. The exhibition brings about thirty documentary photographs of transgender people from the Balkans, which contextualize their personal stories and problems, but also question the challenges facing this community. In addition to photographs, biographical sketches of persons are presented, as well as quotations and parts of conversations that directly confront the observer with the personal side of transgenderism.

"Plastic Museum 2021"



The SOLIDARNA Foundation co-financed the implementation of the project "Museum of Plastics 2021" which was implemented by the Pula Gymnasium in the period from 24.02.2020. until 30.09.2020. The purpose of the project was to raise public awareness of the issue of plastic waste by encouraging empathy and action through the production of songs and videos "Planet Plastics".

"All those sensations in my stomach"



The SOLIDARNA Foundation supported the organization of a thematic discussion on the issue of transgenderism and the promotion of an animated film supported by the AM CENTER of Audiovisual Culture and Multimedia Zagreb. On Saturday, October 17, 2020, at 11 a.m. in the hall of the Cultural Information Center, a conversation was held with the protagonist of the film *All those sensations in my stomach* with Matija Anna Pleše, whose story and experience of transition from male to female/gender is the backbone of the film at Animafest 2020 deserved special recognition. As part of the conversation, at the Gallery upstairs, visitors to the conversation could see the exhibition of works by Hana Tintor, which was open until October 18, 2020, and shows the works created through the process of working on the film and after it.

Krunoslav Sukić Award 2020.



As part of the "Krunoslav Sukić" 2020 award ceremony for the promotion of peace, non-violence, and human rights, organized by the Center for Peace, Non-Violence and Human Rights Osijek, the SOLIDARNA Foundation also supported the screening of the documentary dance play "IN THE NAME OF THE FATHER" by artists from Bosnia and Herzegovina and Austria and directed by Darrel Toulon. The show was aired online with admission to several countries in the region. The "Krunoslav Sukić" 2020 award was received by Dana Budisavljević, Danka Derifaj, and Lejla Šehić-Relić. The "Krunoslav Sukić" award in 2020 was given to the "One for the Other" Initiative, the Ecumenical Women's Initiative Omiš and Mladen Kožić and Ivo Šegota. Ajna Jusić received a special award "Krunoslav Sukić" in 2020. Recognition "Krunoslav Sukić" Book of the Decade 2010/2020 was awarded to the authors of two books: Dejan Jović (War and Myth: Identity Politics in Contemporary Croatia) and Slaven Rašković and Igor Čoka (Living in Limbo - a book of scars), and Ivana Brlić Mažuranić Elementary School from Ogulin and Vladimir Nazor Elementary School Potpićani received recognition Peace School 2020.

Human Rights Film Festival 2020.



The eighteenth edition of the Festival of Engaged Author's Film, Human Rights Film Festival, was held from 6 to 13 December 2020 in an online arrangement, and the SOLIDARNA Foundation participated in the realization of the program this year as well.

As part of the festival, and on the occasion of the International Day of Human Rights and the celebration of 5 years of the SOLIDARNA Foundation in cooperation with the European Parliament Office in Zagreb, a public online debate #Solidarity as our #NewNormal ?, was held. In debate, experts discussed sustainable solidarity, mutual protection of dignity, and human rights due to the shared experience of a pandemic and a global crisis. Is there a chance that precisely because of this anxious collective experience of the crisis, an opportunity for solidarity will open up as a fundamental principle of the organization of production, social and political relations?

This great and important question was discussed by the futurologist Dr.sc. Eamonn Noonan, Global Trends Unit, European Parliament, Sustainability Experts Ph.D. Mirjana Matešić, Croatian Business Council for Sustainable Development and Ph.D. Mladen Domazet, Institute of Political Ecology, Professor of Psychology and Social Work prof.dr.sc. Marina Ajduković, Study Center for Social Work at the Faculty of Law in Zagreb, and feminist theologian and human rights activist mr.sc. Lana Bobić, In good faith, with commentary by the editor of Faktograf Petar Vidov and a member of the Croatian Debate Society Anastazije Stupar.

The current crisis, which is shaking the very foundations of our families, communities, and societies, is painfully confronting us with the consequences of insensitivity, exploitation of nature, and structural inequalities, all participants in the discussion agreed. As individuals and society, we are still able to show solidarity, but also to allow suffering, inequality, injustice, and mistrust to deepen.

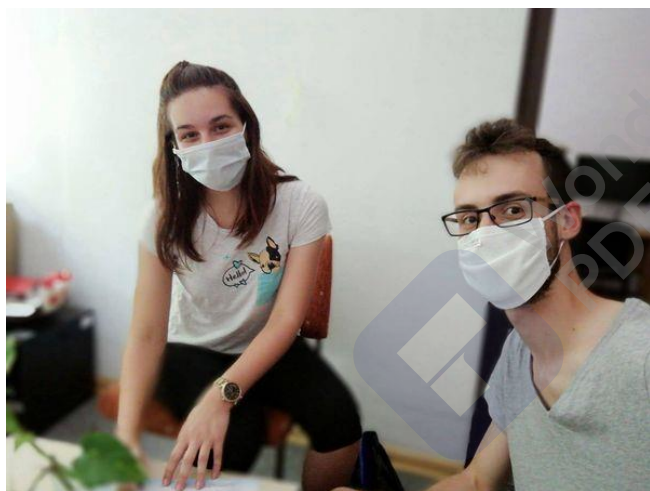
Also, the SOLIDARNA Foundation financially supported this year's workshop for young critics Kurziva - Platform for Culture, Media and Society, which resulted in a series of mentored reviews

and film reviews of the Human Rights Film Festival, published on www.kulturpunkt.hr. This collaborative activity contributes to the sensitization of young film and literary critics on human rights issues, as well as the development of the audience and HRRF.

“Drive-in culture”

In July 2020, the SOLIDARNA Foundation signed donation agreements with 10 Zagreb students within the Drive-in Culture project, which was produced by SABMARINE. This humanitarian action raised HRK 10,000.00 in a week and thus helped ten Zagreb students with a one-time donation in the amount of HRK 1,000.00.

The students we supported through our program participated in the University of Zagreb Scholarship Competition in the category of lower socioeconomic status but did not receive funding. Drive-in culture was held from 15 to 17 May 2020 in a hidden parking lot behind the Zagreb Technical Museum and was the first humanitarian event held outdoors in safe epidemiological conditions. Admission to the event was free, all to activate the audience to donate funds to needy students in our community.



We are grateful that with the young team from the creative production SABMARINE, which is behind the Drive-in culture project, we helped the students who need help the most, and also announced that the project will continue its ride under the well-known motto - "Trumpets for culture!".

ACTIONS AND CAMPAIGNS

Urgent donation action of the SOLIDARNA Foundation and Fund 5.5 - SOLIDARITY WITH PETRINJA AND SMŽ

After the devastating earthquake on December 29, 2020. Fund 5.5. for crisis support of the SOLIDARNA Foundation launched an urgent donor action to raise funds for crisis support to earthquake victims in Petrinja and Sisak-Moslavina County, to provide assistance and support to our fellow citizens as soon as possible.

In the first two days, HRK 5.5 million was raised with a growing trend of donations as well as citizens' trust in transparent reporting on emergency activities, which the Fund 5.5 team

immediately undertook to support volunteers in the field and urgent care of citizens. Based on a rapid assessment of field needs, and in consultation with a wide range of humanitarian actors, a Crisis Support Program was formed that provides a framework for humanitarian action of Fund 5.5 in SMC during the coming months of the acute crisis, but throughout 2021. The purpose of the program is to support the processes of emergency care, stabilization, sustainable reconstruction, and recovery of individuals, families, and communities, especially those belonging to the most vulnerable groups.

Campaign with Are You Syrious?

In May 2020, the SOLIDARNA Foundation, in cooperation with the Are You Syrious? and the creative agency Bruketa & Žinić & Gray launched a campaign to provide support to refugee households in Croatia affected by the corona crisis.



During the campaign, another 15 households from the area of Zagreb, Karlovac, and Sisak contacted the association for support, so after collecting the initial HRK 120,000.00, the campaign continued. To collect help for all households in need, citizens got involved by independently organizing donation activities and offering their knowledge, skills, and professional services for fundraising.

Although the campaign was launched to collect aid for 40 households, a total of over HRK 180,000.00 was collected from citizens' donations, and a one-month financial patch of HRK 3,000.00 per household was provided for 60. The campaign was supported by 623 donors, of whom is over 90% from Croatia.

In parallel with providing financial support to all pre-registered households, the Association Are You Syrious? through its integration programs, it continued to provide support to its customers

in finding a new job, which is the only way for them to secure their long-term existence in Croatia. At the same time, the Association and the SOLIDARNA Foundation demanded that the institutions in the new situation take greater responsibility than the legally prescribed minimum.

Support to the police officer

In January 2020, the SOLIDARNA Foundation, the #SPASIME initiative, and the Reproductive Justice Platform organized the "Support a Police Officer" campaign, calling on citizens to donate to support a police officer who lost a lawsuit against a superior colleague, even though she was found to have been sexually abused all night on duty. Despite this, the suspect was released because the abuse "happened only once". Although she acted properly to expose the perpetrator and to prevent him from possibly repeating the violence against other colleagues, the victim of abuse must now pay all court costs for at least 10,000 kunas.



In just 24 hours, the campaign raised as much as HRK 20,818.10, and the citizens with a big heart helped the police officer in settling court costs that she could not cover herself. Since the raised funds doubled the amount requested, the excess funds were used to help other victims of sexual and domestic violence through the #SPASIME Fund.

The verdict was so scandalous that the President of the Supreme Court publicly apologized to the police officer for it, and the citizens who donated made it clear what they thought about the verdicts that acquit the perpetrators because the abuse "happened only once". However, fundraising on a case-by-case basis is not a solution to the problems in the Croatian judiciary. Judges must stop sending messages to society that sexual violence will not always be sanctioned, that the victim's experience is irrelevant, or that such cases are normal. With such verdicts, institutions encourage future perpetrators, while discouraging victims from reporting violence.

Donation action for IT school equipment - TO MAKE THE SCHOOL CLOSER AND EASIER!



Equal access to education is key to building a society of solidarity. A group of scientists from the Faculty of Philosophy, University of Zagreb, is also aware of this and, with the support of SOLIDARNA, launched a humanitarian action aimed at procuring tablets that will enable refugee children to participate in classes. The action lasted until 31.12.2020, donations were paid to the humanitarian account of the SOLIDARNA Foundation, with the indication "Humanitarian action Let's include refugee children in our schools". A total of HRK 41,886.30 was collected, and one person joined the action by directly purchasing tablets. The collected donations ensured the purchase of 31 tablets for 23 children from Zagreb, 2 children from Zadar, 4 from Karlovac, and 2

children from Sisak.

Dad's Festival



The Dad Festival celebrates engaged fathers and equal parenting that is key to the well-being of the family and builds on Swedish photographer Johan Bävman's project - Swedish Dads. The project aims to inspire fathers to be actively involved in the upbringing of children and to initiate a discussion on the importance of fatherhood involved.

As part of the Dad Festival, which we organize in cooperation with Status M and RODA - parents in action and the Embassy of the Kingdom of Sweden, we organized a photo contest in which we want to show the challenges and joys of family life and parenthood in the crown. From November 2nd to 22nd, we shared the received photos on social networks and we are extremely happy that many fathers got involved in the joint action and shared their #SuperTata moments with their loved ones.

Advocacy and support of the SOLIDARNA Foundation

During 2020, the SOLIDARNA Foundation continued to actively support advocacy efforts aimed at protecting and promoting women's human rights and gender equality, and the work of the Platform for Reproductive Justice - an informal collaborative initiative that brings together a broad coalition of allies in the fight to preserve acquired reproductive rights, but also raising the level of reproductive and social rights.

The SOLIDARNA Foundation, as a contribution to the global campaign "16 Days of Activism against Violence against Women", with the #spasime Fund and HR PSOR, with the support of the European Parliament in Croatia has organized a round table ". As part of the round table, we underlined the basic needs of victims of gender-based violence in the workplace and labor market, which relate to safety and quality of jobs but also long-term progress, financial support for crisis costs (from lawyers, through rent to treatment), affordable and professional psychological support.

Together with the Women's Room, CESI, the Defense of the RIGHT TO CHOICE, the RODA Association, and other associations and initiatives, we were part of the "Billion Rises Against Violence Against Women" campaign!

SOLIDARNA joined the action and petition SUMEZ - Croatian Association of Mental Health Associations and Ludruga - 100% People, LifeLine, and Dawn, which required the Government of the Republic of Croatia to urgently include the already prepared National Strategy for Mental Health Development (2020-2030) in the parliamentary procedure and its speedy implementation in practice, including the Mobile Teams and Peer Support Group in the community in the list of existing psychosocial services financed by HZZO, and urgently finding ways to continuously finance programs and projects of associations dealing with psychosocial services in the community.

Community mental health is a public good that we all should nurture and is one of our program focuses. We are proud that during the pandemic we technically enabled the maintenance of online self-help groups and crisis psychiatric support, which was expeditiously organized by the associations Ludruga - 100% People and the Association Lifeline, despite the lack of local funding.

Due to epidemiological measures, there were fewer protests in 2020, but SOLIDARNA supported events of social importance that managed to be organized. We joined the protest in front of Jabuka - FOR the freedom of youth culture, FOR our cultural heritage, FOR Zagreb free from ruling arrogance and corruption!

SOLIDARNA also supported the action of civil society in front of the Serbian embassy: AGAINST playing with human lives and police brutality and the right of citizens to protest, standing in solidarity with everyone in Serbia who fights against the authoritarian state and police brutality.

At the Victims of Fascism Square in Zagreb, we protested in solidarity with the Black Lives Matter movement in the United States and the protests against systematic police violence there and drew attention to the local context.

As every year before, in 2020 SOLIDARNA was part of the Pride Parade, speaking in solidarity for the security, freedom, and pride of every person who makes up the wealth of the LGBTIQ + community and our human race, on every street, in every workplace, in every school and to every home throughout Croatia and the world.

The SOLIDARNA Foundation, together with cooperating associations and foundations from the Ministry of Labor, Pension System, Family, and Social Policy, and the line minister Josip Aladrović, which is responsible for managing the European Social Fund, demanded, among other things, a decision on announcing the tender does not implement the infamous method "FASTEST FINGER".

Following the current election campaign in 2020 and noticing the shortcomings of media houses, the SOLIDARNA Foundation together with a list of about twenty networks, coalitions, and civil society organizations filed an objection to the State Election Commission of the Republic of Croatia on women's underrepresentation in television election debates.

Protection and promotion of human rights in cooperation with the business sector

The Daring - a program to support women in entrepreneurship

In the previous year, SOLIDARNA continued with The Daring - Economic Empowerment Program, which provides professional and financial support to women in entrepreneurship.

The winners of The Daring program launched by IKEA in cooperation with the SOLIDARNA Foundation and the Croatian Business Council for Sustainable Development (HR PSOR), were presented in Zagreb on July 3, 2020, with the expert support of ACT Group, Apsolon, Erste Bank and European Bank for Reconstruction and Development and the Office of the Gender Equality Ombudsman. Out of 138 submitted projects, 23 finalists were shortlisted, and finally, seven women's entrepreneurial initiatives were selected, five of which will receive one-year financial support totaling HRK 250,000, while all will participate in a one-year mentoring program tailored to their needs.



Winners of The Daring 2020 program

The Daring program promotes socially responsible companies owned by women and is conceived as an initial pilot project, supporting 3-5 projects/initiatives of women's entrepreneurial ventures, which have developed product or service lines and are in the post-start-up phase. Financial support in the individual amount of up to HRK 75,000 (a total of HRK 250,000), access to professional information in the form of comprehensive and continuous mentoring support and fast business networking, and easy access to specialist information, training, and consulting services in cooperation with several business organizations. The program is aimed at supporting and promoting socially responsible entrepreneurship run by women and creating quality jobs, especially for members of marginalized social groups.

Among last year's awarded projects is the social enterprise Sustainable Society from Gračac, founded by women from the local Prospero Association to train women in footwear production. With mentoring support and a donation from the Daring program, they will be provided with the purchase of a machine and professional education. This will ensure the continuity of production and strengthen the sale of custom-made anatomical footwear, with the possibility of payment from Croatian Employment Service, which is a sustainable market niche for this unique women's production venture that creates new employment opportunities for women in Gračac.

The Daring donation also went to the Brač craft Fabijanović owned by mother and daughter, as support for business process certification and marketing of the unique women's island product,

which is protective equipment for cots and a wide range of baby bedding under the brand Dada & Rocco.

Thanks to a donation from the Daring program, Organica Vita from the village of Čađavice in Virovitica-Podravina County will increase the efficiency and competitiveness of organic production and processing of medicinal plants and oilseeds. To achieve this, in the next 12 months they will strive to solve three major problems - the purchase of a new oil press, HACCP certification, and the introduction of a system to monitor the production of eEye in their production facilities.

The donation from the Daring program goes to the Šibenik to the company Primitivance, which produces 100% natural cosmetics from raw materials that grow in the Dalmatian climate so that in the next stages of development production can be transferred there and thus complete the sustainability cycle. The donation will support the development of two new products and the Belle de Jour mini range with the support of the women's pharmaceutical team from Ljubljana, all the way to marketing.

The Daring will also financially support the online school of Croatian as a foreign language by SpeakCRO company Cosmis Is j.d.o.o. from Zagreb, whose intention is to develop a digital platform with quality didactic materials, expand the scope of clients around the world and create two more jobs, well-paid jobs for female teachers.

The Daring mentoring program additionally included two interesting start-ups - the project "Biljkoborci" again, two of them, and "Ćiri biri bajka" from Pixing from Zagreb, with a focus on developing business management capacity and strategic approach to alternative sources of funding. The mentoring program will last throughout the year with the support of experts from associate corporations and business advisors of the Daring program.

Seven winners of the Daring 2020 support will learn how to plan a business through the design thinking method, get opportunities for specialist consulting, personal development of leadership skills, and business networking and promotion. The introductory business planning workshop on July 3 and 4 in Zagreb was led by Andrijana Parić from the company Apsolon, while the main mentor for the development of business plans was Ana Brigović from the ACT group.

The Daring project was launched on December 10, 2018, and its goal is to provide professional and financial support to women in entrepreneurship. To this date, 13 entrepreneurial initiatives have received support through the Daring program - ten financial, two mentoring support, while a supply contract has been signed with the social enterprise Fierce Women for the project of eponymous playing cards celebrating women's contribution to humanity. All proceeds from the sale of tickets will be donated by IKEA for the new editions of the Daring competition. Since recently, tickets were only available in English, IKEA also financed the production of a Croatian version, which is sold exclusively at the IKEA Zagreb department store.

“Work Equality for All!”

"Work Equality for All!" Is a project implemented in partnership with the Gender and Media Culture Space K-Zone, Lesbian Organization Rijeka LORI, SOLIDARNA - Foundation for Human Rights and Solidarity, and Stichting Centrum Tumba from the Netherlands since January 2019. The project aims to contribute to the protection of rights and combating discrimination against LGBTI people in the workplace and employment through the development and implementation of educational models and tools, knowledge exchange, and fostering cooperation between unions, employers, and civil society organizations.



As part of the project, the Equality at Work Indicator was implemented in Croatia for the second time - an instrument by which organizations can measure their performance and performance in the reduction discrimination based on sexual orientation and/or gender identity and expression and the creation of an inclusive environment in the workplace.

Innovative project methods include the use of film and theater arts, to educate and sensitize employers, employees, and the LGBTI community to promote social cohesion and promote equality in the workplace. The development and implementation of policies and practices for the protection of the rights of LGBTI employees and jobseekers will contribute to combating discrimination based on sexual orientation and/or gender identity and expression in the workplace and, consequently, in other segments of life. The SOLIDARNA Foundation is involved in shaping educational content, connecting with employers' organizations and trade unions, and promotional activities. The 'Employment for All!' The project is funded by the European Union from the European Union's Rights, Equality and Citizenship Program (2014-2020).

IKEA's "A Place Like Home" project

To support local communities in crisis, IKEA conducted an international project "A Place Like Home" during the pandemic, which fits the specific needs of protecting vulnerable groups in a pandemic, in partnership with a local philanthropic organization. Continuing the previous successful cooperation, the SOLIDARNA Foundation was entrusted with a donation of EUR 34,000 aimed at supporting women and children of domestic violence, socially vulnerable families with children, the elderly, and the protection of mental health in the community in times of crisis.

The project started in August 2020 and provided quick financial support for the reconstruction of counseling and shelters of the Autonomous Women's House Zagreb in the amount of HRK 33,750 as well as the continuity of the #spasime Fund in conditions of social isolation which makes it even harder to get out of violence. The project continues until the end of February 2021 and includes support to the SOLIDARNA Foundation in the complex distribution of a large donation of IKEA coronavirus protection equipment to community health services, which we have been preparing together since July 2020 and realized in the first quarter of 2021. all results for our next annual report.

Providing services in the field of philanthropy

Student actions against climate change

In November 2019, a call for tenders "Student actions against climate change" was announced total value of HRK 80,000.00. The purpose of the call for proposals was to support schools, dormitories, and school student clubs in stronger social action during the Croatian Presidency of the Council of the EU regarding the challenge of climate change as one of the burning global problems and priorities of the Croatian Presidency.

The competition was open from November 14, 2019, to December 21 until 11:59 p.m. In the period from the beginning of the competition on November 14, to the end of the competition on December 21, 52 applications were received, which indicates a good response from students and high schools and interest in climate action whose main advocates are young people.



Activities continued in 2020. The Foundation Board of the SOLIDARNA Foundation instructed the Secretary of the Foundation Ivan Blažević to carry out the procedure of contracting small financial support for the implementation of projects with selected institutions that applied for the tender

on February 3, 2020, following the PRAG 2016 procedure and funding conditions proposed by the Evaluation Committee.

The Evaluation Committee, which consisted of 6 members, conducted an evaluation procedure from 10 to 23 January 2020, and adopted the Proposal for the award of 10 small financial grants with a total value of HRK 80,000, which also contains a proposal for the number of approved grants. The reserve list of applications included 3 applications in the total value of HRK 25,441.86, which were proposed for funding if one of the selected applicants withdrew.

In the period from 27 January to 3 February 2020, the SOLIDARNA Foundation, in its role of contracting authority, carried out the procedure of contracting small grants with project applicants.

Organizational achievements of SOLIDARNA in 2020.

In 2020, SOLIDARNA managed to ensure continuity of work despite the coronavirus and earthquake pandemic, and the fact that since the beginning of the year there is no predictable source of financial support for institutional development, which covers the costs of operational costs and continuous professional development.

The fifth-year of existence for our small team was more than challenging, but thanks to constant collaborators, volunteers, supporters, we managed to cope with the increase in work due to the effects of earthquakes and coronaviruses.

In response to the growing needs and the best possible organization of the work and activities of SOLIDARNA, at the end of 2020, our team grew from three full-time employees to five. The communication team got its leader Azra Ayyash, and at the end of the year, the financial and administrative team was joined by Bojana Sečkar. In December last year, Boris Jokić, director of the Institute for Social Research in Zagreb, became a new member of the SOLIDARNA Foundation Board, and we greatly appreciate his decision to volunteer to contribute to the growth and development of SOLIDARNA.

Unfortunately, even during 2020, the SOLIDARNA Foundation failed to provide more working space in public lease (City of Zagreb or the Republic of Croatia), as well as the complete digitalization of business, which is our priority for organizational development in the coming year.

Collaborative network and SOLIDARNA volunteers

In its work, SOLIDARNA continues to rely heavily on the voluntary and material contributions of its founders and associates, which is its long-term strategy of mobilizing the community to protect human rights and its own sustainability. FINANCIAL REPORT FOR 2020

In the fifth year, SOLIDARNA continued the trend of revenue growth, which allows us to continue working and gives the wind in the back to our engagement around new initiatives, philanthropic programs, campaigns, and active support of the most vulnerable groups and protection of human rights.

Every year, revenues double at a steady pace, from HRK 182,347 in 2016, HRK 434,918 in 2017, and HRK 870,396 in 2018 to HRK 1,777,819 in 2019 and HRK 3,329,686 in 2020. As before, most revenues were mobilized from the private sector and citizens, and the implementation of the Active Citizenship Fund program, where SOLIDARNA acts as an implementing partner, contributed to the increase in revenues mobilized for further donations.

During the crisis of the pandemic and earthquake that hit the Republic of Croatia, SOLIDARNA, although still a young Foundation, proved to be an organization to which trust and money were entrusted by both citizens and corporations, and we managed to help those on the brink of extinction, and start new partnerships with our donors.

The current organizational budget is sufficient to cover the basic staff and operating costs of SOLIDARNA, and as before, the work of SOLIDARNA is largely "subsidized" by volunteer work and support in kind from supporters, such as the Federation of Independent Trade Unions of Croatia, which subsidizes the SOLIDARNA office.

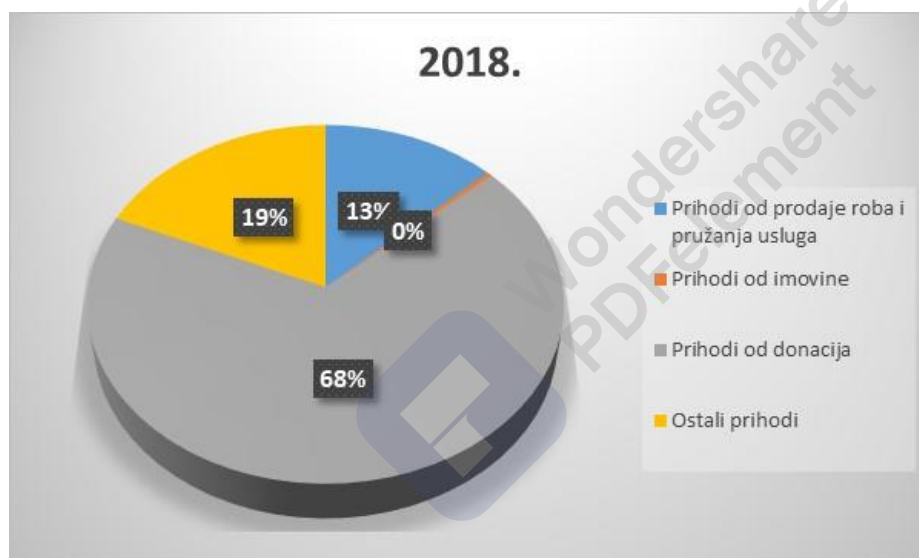
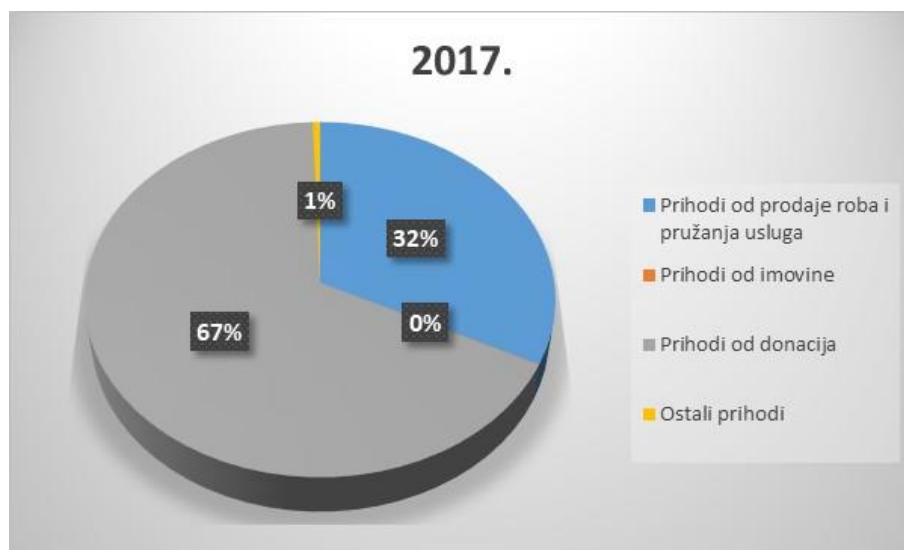

Revenues in 2020

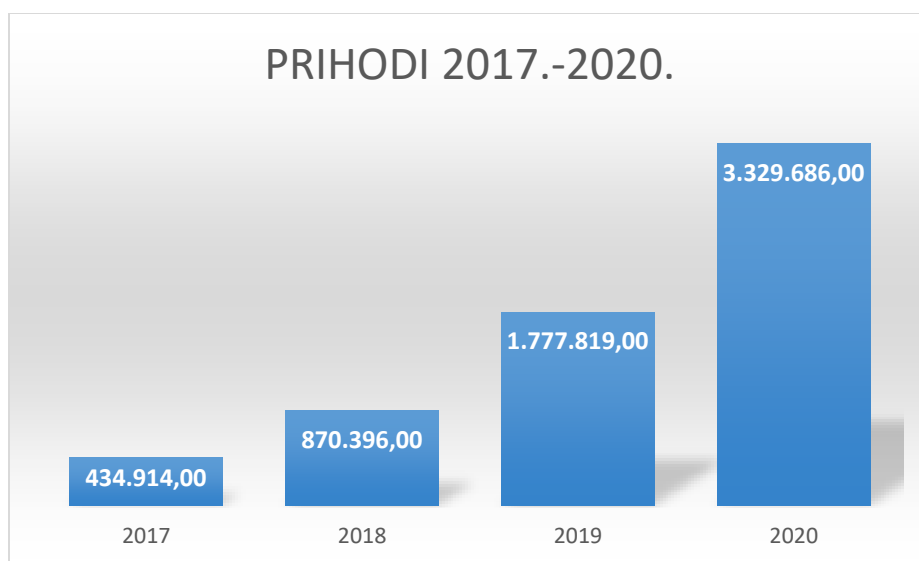

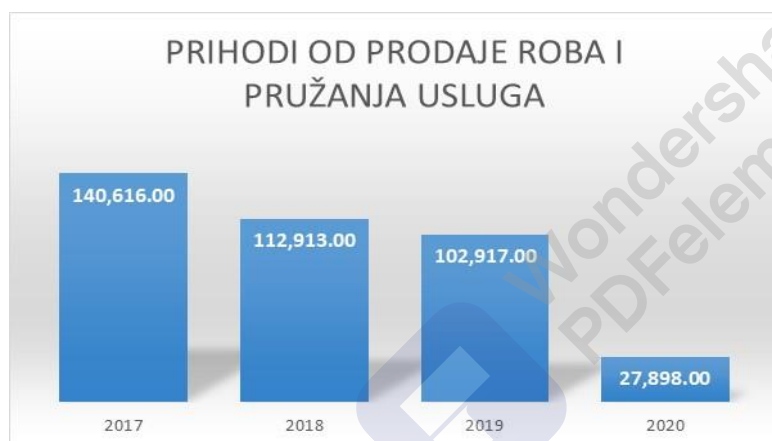

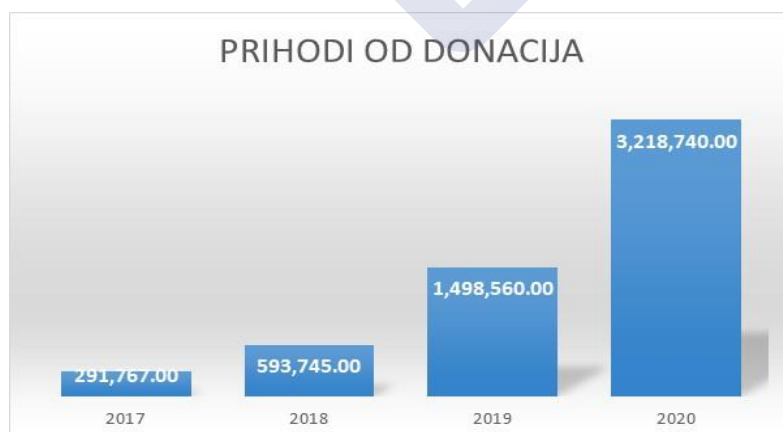
PRIHODI 2017.-2020.



PRIHODI OD PRODAJE ROBA I PRUŽANJA USLUGA



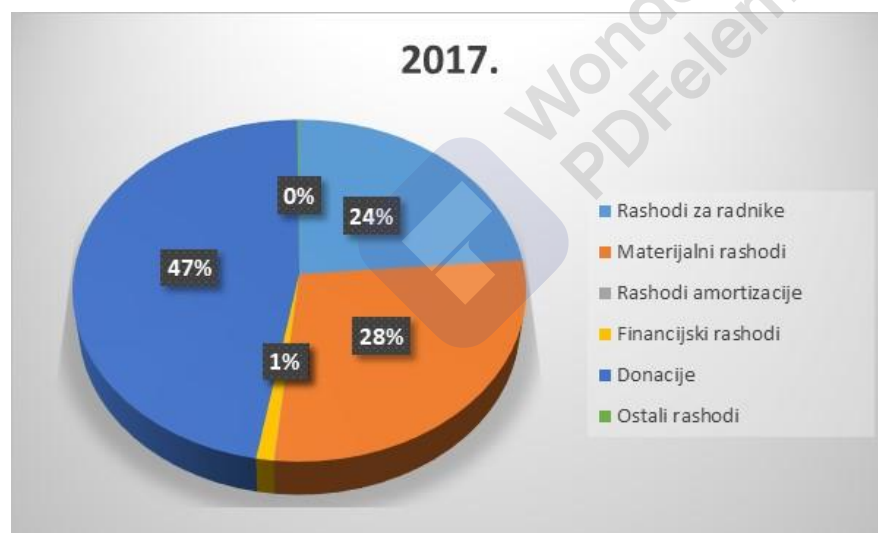

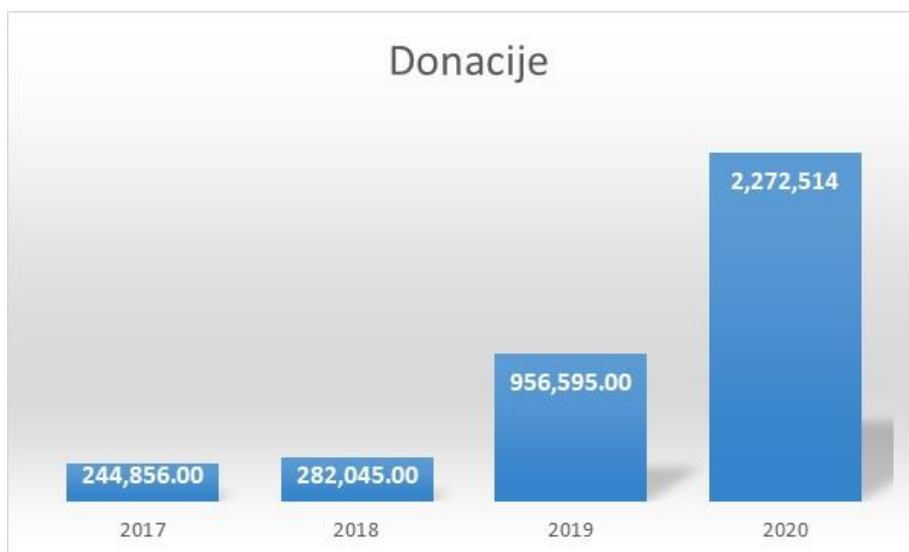

- Further consolidation of organizational procedures, digitalization of business, and expansion of scope and the competence of the executive team in line with the trend of expanding opportunities for philanthropic action
- Systematic attraction of permanent small donors of thematic funds and overall activities
