INTRODUCTION

The annual report on the work of SOLIDARNA - Foundation for Human Rights and Solidarity for 2022 has been prepared by the director of the Foundation, Ivan Blažević, with Karla Pudar, Secretary General and Marina Škrabalo, Program advisor of the Foundation. The financial part of the report was prepared by Minja Marinčić, Expert associate for finance and administration.

The annual report was discussed and adopted by the SOLIDARNA Foundation Board.

SOLIDARNA Foundation strategic plan is formed in three-year cycles in accordance with the opportunities for action and current possibilities. From 2020 to the end of 2023, SOLIDARNA Foundation focused its activities on **four strategic goals:** (1) providing effective and flexible support to active citizens and human rights defenders, (2) developing a culture of solidarity and philanthropy for human rights through cross-sectoral cooperation and citizen mobilization, (3) stability and continuity of the organization's activities, and (4) increasing of the foundation's resources.

The beginning of 2022 was marked by work on the earthquake-affected Sisak-Moslavina County, and throughout the year we continued to be present on the ground both as humanitarians and as donors. In addition to the bureaucratic struggles to complete the construction of the planned houses, in 2022 we also implemented a series of cultural and artistic programs in Bania to revive the cultural and social potential of this region. Also, the beginning of the year, but also its continuation, was marked by the war in Ukraine, and as a response to the refugee crisis, the SOLIDARNA Foundation established the **Solidarity with Ukraine Fund**, which provides short-term and long-term support to Ukrainians in Croatia.

In its advocacy work, SOLIDARNA continues to work with partner organizations to protect women's human rights and fight against gender-based violence, which was especially evident with the establishment of the **Croatian Women's Fund**, the first such fund in the Republic of Croatia. **Croatian Women's Fund** completes the previous work of the SOLIDARNA Foundation in the fight against violence, the realization of every woman's right to a life without violence, the right to affordable health care, and the right to political, economic and social equality.

Despite the crisis and working conditions, the Foundation continued the activities of existing programs, such as the implementation of the Active Citizenship Fund donated by the Kingdom of Norway and the European Economic Area, within which we act as an implementing partner in a consortium led by the Osijek Puzzle Foundation also with SMART from Rijeka and the Slovenian umbrella organization CNVOS from Ljubljana. We also continued the implementation of the Health Observatory project led by the Krijesnica Association together with partner organizations, specifically 11 associations, which aims to strengthen the capacity of civil society



organizations to achieve effective dialogue with the public administration, social partners and scientific higher education institutions in the design and implementation of reforms.

The SOLIDARNA Foundation in the previous year can boast of revenue growth in the previous year, which is an indicator of SOLIDARNA's successful positioning as a reliable partner for the public and business sectors and citizens. Special thanks to all our donors and the public for their trust!

PROGRAM ACHIEVEMENTS IN 2022

#saveme Fund - FOR EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE AND PROTECTION OF VICTIMS OF GENDER-CONDITIONAL VIOLENCE

In cooperation with the #SAVEME Initiative, the SOLIDARNA Foundation in 2019 established the #saveme Fund with the aim of providing emergency assistance and protection of victims of domestic, partner and sexual violence. From then until the end of 2022, through the #saveme Fund, we supported 140 women and 230 children with the financial support they needed to leave a violent environment (financing of rent, living, legal or health expenses and psychotherapy or education of women or children). The beneficiaries of support were of different ages (from 9 to 58 years old) and from different backgrounds, but thanks to the fund's support, they started a life without violence.



In 2022, the Council of the #saveme Fund approved **35 applications for financial support** in the total amount of 165,226.00 HRK/21,929.26 EUR, which gave 26 women with children help and support in building a safe future and a life without violence for themselves and their children. In 2022, the #saveme fund also awarded 1 financial support to a man, a victim of gender-based violence.

Most individual grants (15) were paid for **living expenses** (costs of food, clothing and

hygiene items), then **for rent** (12), **legal and court costs** (6), **psychotherapy costs** (2), which shows that housing and financial dependence on the abuser and the risk of poverty are one of the main reasons why women remain in a violent environment. The highest individual donation was HRK 9,000/ EUR 1,194.51 for legal expenses, while the lowest was HRK 800.00/ EUR 106.18 for living expenses.

In November 2021, the fund received a donation from the **L'Oreal Fund for Women** in the amount of 15,000 euros. In the one year duration of the project until November 2022, thanks to the L'Oreal donation, **we supported 19 women and (more than the planned 15) 18 children** with financial support. Most of the funds were used to finance the rent (HRK 62,000/EUR 8,228), then legal fees (HRK 37,000/EUR 4,910), and finally psychotherapy



(HRK 8,500/EUR 1,128). L'Oreal's donation provided us with additional funds and enabled us to support an even larger number of women than planned.

In November 2022, the #saveme Fund, as a single program unit, will grow into the **Croatian Women's Fund**, through which, among other activities, financial support will continue to be provided to victims of domestic and sexual violence from all parts of the Republic of Croatia.

Croatian Women's Fund

Since its establishment at the end of 2015, the SOLIDARNA – Foundation for Human Rights and Solidarity set the protection of women's rights and the promotion of gender equality as one of the priorities.

The vision of the Croatian Women's Fund is to build a community where equality is our reality, where even the most vulnerable members have their basic needs met and the opportunity to realize their potential.



With the establishment of the Croatian Women's Fund, SOLIDARNA **completes its previous work** on the realization of every woman's right to a life without violence, the right to accessible health care, and the right to political, economic, and social equality. The Croatian Women's Fund operates through four program pillars of the



fund: assistance to victims of domestic and sexual violence, reproductive health, economic empowerment, education and prevention, and advocacy.

CRISIS AID FOR VICTIMS OF SEXUAL AND DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

The Croatian Women's Fund will continue the work of the #saveme fund, providing financial support to victims of domestic and sexual violence of all ages. A precondition for granting financial assistance from the Women's Fund is a report of violence to the police or a center for social welfare or a medical report in the case of domestic and sexual violence. The allocated financial resources have so far been mainly used to finance rent and living expenses, then for legal expenses, education of women and children, and health expenses and psychotherapy.

REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH

The Women's Fund program is dedicated to promoting reproductive health and rights, with an emphasis on high-quality information and services. The goals of our work are to improve the quality of comprehensive health and sexual education, to ensure access to health services, and to enable women and young people to independently make their own decisions about reproductive health. A precondition for granting financial support from the Women's Fund for insurance reproductive health is: specialist report and/or referral from a specialist or other evidence of health status, a person older than 16 years, a person under the age of 16 represented by a legal representative (one of the parents) or the guardian assigned to her by the court, except in case of insecurity and/or threat to life and health minors when a person can ask for help independently.

ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT

The Women's Fund continues the work of the Brave program with the aim of economic empowerment of women through direct support to women entrepreneurs and through cooperation with employers to ensure gender equality in the workplace.

EDUCATION AND PREVENTION

The Women's Fund continues to conduct education on domestic and sexual violence and human rights in order to create a long-term improvement in the respect of women's human rights. The foundation cooperates with schools and companies in order to provide quality and science-based education to women and men and to create internal procedures in the case of sexual violence in business environments (in the workplace).

ADVOCACY

All the mentioned programs, in addition to direct support to the users, include advocacy work. We consider these two components inseparable because it is precisely by working directly with those whose rights are violated and threatened that we can see what can be improved in the public system and advocate the necessary changes.

From November 29, 2022 to December 31, 2022, a total of HRK 267,020.37 (EUR 35,439.69) was paid to the giro sub-account of the Fund for Women of the SOLIDARNA Foundation.



"Solidarity with Ukraine" Fund

Learned from previous experiences of crises (earthquake and pandemic), the **SOLIDARNA Foundation** launched the "Solidarity with Ukraine" Fund and with the support and trust of numerous citizens, companies and all good people, readily welcomed new fellow citizens.

By founding the Fund, we wanted to provide support to people who have chosen Croatia as their new home, through **short-term financial support** to ensure basic life needs and **long-term support** such as learning the Croatian language. In coordination with civil society organizations and public bodies, we followed the dynamics of the crisis, responding to the needs of refugees and their families the best we could.



From the beginning of the donation campaign on March 15, 2022 through December 31, 2022, 109,416.89 euros were collected in the "Solidarity with Ukraine" Fund. During the year 2022/23, two public calls for the allocation of financial support were permanently opened. One call s intended for direct financial support to refugees from Ukraine who have living expenses that they cannot meet from their own or other sources. The second call is open for projects/programs/initiatives dealing with support and assistance to displaced persons from Ukraine on an individual and collective level.

Many fellow citizens showed their solidarity with generous donations. During the very launch of the fund, **Agency 404**, whose employees created the visual identity of the Solidarity with Ukraine Fund, was of great help in visual promotion. With the beginning of the donor campaign, **Pivovara Medvedgrad** was one of the first to show its support, donating all of its earnings through the Zamado web shop from March 17 to 19 to help refugees. Many thanks also to the music collective **Živa Voda**, which supported the Fund by organizing two humanitarian concerts, thus sending a message of peace and solidarity. Finally, we are extremely grateful for the very generous donation of the leading regional IT company Infobip in the amount of 507,000 HRK / 67,290.46 EUR, thus once again showing the importance of humanity, solidarity and socially responsible business.

Thanks to all private and corporate donors, we managed to show that with the collected funds a solidary and open society is possible. Through the Fund we supported 164 families. As part of the Fund, we also supported the work of 5 associations, and with over 100 beneficiaries. Thank you to our members and councilmembers of the Fund for their engagement and support in the operation of the Fund throughout the year.

Financial support



The direct financial support that we grant through the Fund goes towards urgent help for people in the first steps of a new life, giving them a sense of security. The lowest allocated direct financial support is 212.36 euros, and the highest is 995.72 euros. Support was awarded to families all over Croatia: Novi Vinodolski, Velika Gorica, Osijek, Zagreb, Samobor, Dubrovnik, Grubišno Polje, Marčana.

The fund also supported **five associations**, which work directly with refugees from Ukraine, provide them with support in registering for residence, using the rights of the Center for Social Welfare, delivering hot meals, continuously working on counseling and providing psychosocial support and counseling, conducting activities for children from Ukraine without adequate care, they organize gatherings in the community, etc. Among the supported organizations are: **Vestigium association** with 6,636.14 euros, **FICE Croatia** with 6,636.14 euros, **Society for Psychological Assistance** (DPP) with 6,636.14 euros, **European Development Center of Initiatives – RECI** with 6,636.14 euros and **DKolectiv** with 6,628.18 euros.



Helping self-employed or micro-entrepreneurs to continue doing what they know best is one of the priorities of the Fund's work, and we are extremely glad that we supported two Ukrainian women and their Morra Ceramics brand by purchasing a ceramic kiln, and Nastya and Yana continued to produce and sell ceramics, but also across Croatia started a wave of "ceramic workshops" for children in cooperation with schools, kindergartens and associations.

Knowledge of the Croatian language – a priority for integration

Through the work of the "Solidarity with Ukraine" Fund, Croatian language courses have proven to be a priority for Ukrainians. Knowledge of the language helps in integration, empowers them, makes them independent and provides access to the labor market. Thanks to donations and great professors, **more than 300 people took language courses** organized by the SOLIDARNA Foundation. One course consists of 50 hours, and the levels range from beginner A1 to B2. The groups numbered roughly 10 participants and **over 1000 hours of Croatian language** courses were held.



SVOJA

Every bad event brings something good. As such, the arrival of great women from Ukraine started the association "Svoja" in Zagreb, which means "our" in Ukrainian. The association helps all refugees in Croatia, with a focus on employment, care and welfare for children, coping with Croatian institutions and accommodation. The SOLIDARNA Foundation is a permanent partner of the "Svoja" association and a supporter of this great idea continuing to grow and develop.

FUND 5.5: SOLIDARITY REMAINS ON BANIA

On 29th December 2020, a mere few hours after the devastating earthquake hit Petrinja and the surrounding towns in Sisak-Moslavina County, the SOLIDARNA Foundation reactivated the 5.5 Fund intended for crisis support after the earthquake. Through a big humanitarian action 'In Solidarity with Petrinja and SMC' 17.290.270,51 HRK was gathered for aid to victims of the earthquake thanks to donations from 27,614 citizens and 637 corporate donors.

The project Fund 5.5 of the SOLIDARNA Foundation is the national winner of the European Citizen Award through which the European Parliament values the work of civil associations, organisations, and individuals in promoting understanding and strengthening European unity.



On 31.12.2021. the donor campaign "Solidarity with Petrinja and SMŽ" ended, and we did not collect funds for the earthquake-affected area through 2022. During 2022, we continued to be active and present in Bania and worked on the revitalization of the area affected by the earthquake. As humanitarians and donors on the field in 2022, we witnessed the need for all forms of crisis support, as was the case in the first months after the earthquake.



During 2022, the SOLIDARNA Foundation continued to advocate for the recovery of the earthquake-affected area in dozens of media appearances (open letters, press releases, guest appearances in the media). We asked the authorities to take responsibility for delays in reconstruction, to increase the efficiency of public services in the reconstruction and recovery of communities in their full spectrum, from construction and housing, health and social care, through education and employment opportunities, to free legal aid and support to farmers.




For the social recovery and empowerment of citizens in the earthquake-affected area, together with the Serbian National Council, we implemented the cultural and artistic program "Banija is awakening" from spring to winter 2022, and you can read more about the program modules under the chapter of the report "Culture in the Community".

Desa & Jerko Baković Fund

The Desa and Jerko Baković Fund was launched in February 2018 with a generous donation from Mrs. Desa Baković in the amount of HRK 600,000 (EUR 79.633). Mrs. Baković (1917-2019) and her late husband (1916-2010) wanted the donation to be used to support the education of poor children. The fund is dedicated to providing material, financial and professional support to children and young people of primary and secondary school age who are exposed to material deprivation or social exclusion and discrimination.





Scholars are provided with multi-year, comprehensive and individualized support. Primary school students are mostly provided with material support in the form of financial resources for school books, IT equipment, additional learning support, extracurricular activities, school trips and the like. High school students often need support in their education outside their residence in the form of funding for a student dormitory, books, accessories, IT equipment, pocket money, additional learning support, extracurricular activities, trips, and the like. The fund also supports individual advisory monitoring of scholarship recipients by an expert from the child's educational environment. Furthermore, the Fund supports trips, workshops and camps as additional opportunities for the growth and development of scholarship holders. Scholars of the Fund come from different backgrounds, mostly from villages and municipalities in Kordun, Banovina and peripheral areas towards Lika and Gorski Kotar, as well as from the areas of Međimurje, Slavonia, Rijeka and Zagreb.

At the beginning of the calendar year 2022, the Fund awarded scholarships to 16 students. With the beginning of the 2022/2023 school year, the Fund will grant scholarships to six students.

Active Citizenship Fund in Croatia

Under the leadership of the Slagalica Foundation CFS from Osijek and in cooperation with SMART from Rijeka and the Slovenian umbrella organization CNVOS from Ljubljana, the SOLIDARNA Foundation in 2020 began implementing the Active Citizenship Fund in Croatia, a donor program of the Kingdom of Norway and the European Economic Area focused on the values of respect for human dignity, freedom, democracy, equality, and the rule of law, which fully corresponds to the mission and priorities of our Foundation. EUR 8.5 million in grants have been provided for the implementation of the program in Croatia by the end of 2024. The consortium that



manages the Fund was trusted for this in an international public tender, a decision which reflects a recognition of local philanthropy in Croatia.

Priority areas of support for the Active Citizenship Fund are: 1) democracy, active citizenship, good governance and transparency, 2) human rights and equal treatment through the prevention of discrimination based on race or ethnic origin, religion or belief, gender, disability, age, sexual orientation or gender identity, 3) social justice and social inclusion of vulnerable groups, 4) gender equality and prevention of gender-based violence, and 5) climate change and the environment. The purpose of the Active Citizenship Fund is to strengthen cooperation between organizations from Croatia and donor countries of the program, and to improve regional cooperation in the civil society sector.

The SOLIDARNA Foundation, within the Active Citizenship Fund, will continue to operate in 2023 as a member responsible for the regular administration and monitoring of projects funded through the call for ad hoc action projects and for building advocacy and organizational capacity of civic initiatives across the country.

The main purpose of the Call for Ad Hoc Action Projects is to support civil society organizations and civic initiatives in situations that require an urgent response, either in the face of immediate challenges and threats (for example, pressures on civic space and hate speech) or immediate opportunities to influence public opinion and political processes through various forms of citizen participation and public action, including campaigns, advocacy, legal methods, communications and others.

Anti-Burnout Solutions Camp

In September 2022, the SOLIDARNA Foundation with 6 other partners ACF programs organized the Anti-Burnout Solutions Camp hosted by ACF Croatia. The camp was visited by 82 participants from 13 countries - from Norway and Poland to Romania and Greece, from Latvia and the Czech Republic to Slovenia and Croatia. From September 13 to 17, we explored together how to counter professional and activist burnout in our organizations, donor programs, and communities.

Camp participants find themselves in situations every day in which they provide support to members of various social groups, be it logistical, programmatic, or some other type of support. For their support to be as high-quality as possible, they need certain support, and one of them can be the so-called peer support - support within the environment in which they are. We have mentioned this word many times, but it is really important to us.

Only through joint work, cross-sector cooperation and networking can we "jump over" the challenges that come our way.

Anti-Burnout Solutions The camp was organized in partnership by 6 ACF programs: Croatia, Active Citizens Fund, Latvia Aktīvo įdunogo fonds, Poland Program Aktywni Obywatele - Fundusz Krajowy, Poland Program Aktywni Obywatele - Fundusz Regionalny, Romania Active Citizens Fund - Romania, Slovenia Active Citizens Fund - Slovenia.



"Culture in the Community" Program

The "Culture in the Community" program was launched by the SOLIDARNA Foundation in 2016 with the aim of creating new opportunities for already-recognized creators to produce socially engaged artistic work as well as affirming young and non-established creators who explore human rights issues in interesting ways. The Culture in the Community program focuses on cultural creativity that promotes the values of human rights and solidarity.

Colors of solidarity

As part of the "Culture in the Community" program, the Street Art Festival "The colors of Solidarity" was successfully held in Petrinja, Jabukovac, and Glina in June, organized by the SOLIDARNA Foundation, the IKS Association in Petrinja, the Grafitti na Gradelle platform, and with the support of the Montessori Group and the Atlantic Group. The festival was organized to revive the cultural and public life of the earthquake-affected area by encouraging young people to express themselves creatively.



A special attraction was the presentation of painted murals by famous Croatian street art artists Lunar in Petrinja and Chez 186 in Glina and by the artist Agata Lučić in Jabukovac, who included the students of the Jabukovac Elementary School in the creation of her work. Art workshops for interested teachers and artists interested in pedagogical work were also held, raising local educational competencies and community revitalization. As part of



the project sponsored by the cities of Petrinja and Glina, graffiti and street art workshops were held during May. for young people.

The project "Bania is Awakening"

In the area of Banija, SOLIDARNA supports not only material but also cultural reconstruction. Thus, in cooperation with the Serbian National Council, we launched and implemented the cultural and artistic program "Bania is Awakening".

The programs is realized as intergenerational and inclusive and provided the participants with the possibility of their own cultural expression and creativity. The implementation of the program was realized in cooperation with a number of local stakeholders from the public, non-profit and business, philanthropic-minded sector, which was reflected as a positive influence on the development of new collaborative relationships and on the quality of not only cultural but also social capital in this region.



As part of the "Bania wakes up" project, the following activities were held during the year: children's **workshops I tell you a Story**, handwork workshops **Hand in Hand**, 2 two-day workshops on mental health protection through creativity and art of **Forum KRIK**, the big first **Regional fair of culture of development cooperation**, the discursive program at the Human Rights Film Festival and the implementation of the workshop-research activity of Bania cook.





The activities "I am telling you story" were realized in collaboration with pedagogue and academic artist Ana Zubak, who through a unique methodology developed under the name Secret Forest Society. The "Bania is Awakening" program officially began on July 11 with children's workshops in Glina called "Secret Forest Society" intended for preschool and early school-age children, which encouraged research, problem-solving, listening, and connecting with nature. The goals of the workshop were to encourage creativity and environmental awareness in the youngest generations. A total of 7 workshops were held, namely: three workshops in Glina in cooperation with the container settlement, three workshops in Mali Gradac in cooperation with ADRA, and one workshop in Hrastovica at the Inclusive Farm of the Association of Persons with Disabilities. Writer Mirna Brođanec also participated in the workshop in Hrastovica, on that occasion read her picture book with the children, in which she thematized her upbringing as a girl with disabilities.

"Hand in hand" is a handwork workshop realized in cooperation with the Belgrade art collectives ŠKART and nePraktične žene in a container settlement in Glina for 4 days with the aim of a contemporary reinterpretation of the traditional approach to embroidering kitchen towels with conscious slogans on the theme of the lives of vulnerable groups in the region affected by the earthquake. The workshops often lasted 4-5 hours, because in



addition to the practical artistic work of writing poetry, drawing and embroidery, there was often a story of therapeutic effect and an exchange of life stories, but also a review of the space and the situation in which they are. During those four days, we gave the women in Glina the opportunity for additional cultural content, but also for socializing, which is healing, both for them and for us.



In September, as part of the same program, the first **Regional Development Cooperation Culture Fair** was held in Petrinja, organized by the SOLIDARNA Foundation and partners: the Serbian National Council, the IKS Association, the Regional Foundation ZAMAH, and the ACT Group, with the patronage of the City of Petrinja and the Tourist Board of the City of Petrinja and the financial support of the Office for human rights and rights of national minorities of the Government of the Republic of Croatia, the Office of the European Parliament and Fund 5.5 and partners. This one-day development fair for the exchange and promotion of good practices, knowledge, products, and services based on the culture of development cooperation between local stakeholders from different sectors, to exchange knowledge in the field of cultural management, marketing, and networking with potential donors and partners and strengthen local philanthropy, and thus the sustainability of local innovations in the field of culture and civil society, gathered around 500 visitors, participants, and speakers, as well as the media. At the fair, two public debates were held on the topic of regional development and urban regeneration in the region, as well as informative and educational sessions and workshops, and at the end of the Good Food Fair where local restaurateurs and OPGs were presented.





CRY Forum is an educational meeting of artists, community helpers, and development experts dedicated to mental health protection and community recovery through art, creativity, and cooperation. The first two-day forum of CRY was held at OPG Unski biser near Dvor on Una, where 27 participants from all over Croatia gathered who took part in the program with an emphasis on stakeholders from Sisak-Moslavina County, and several guests who came to individual program units. The second two-day CRY Forum was held at OPG Kezele in Šumećani, where 30 participants and experts gathered. The program of the KRIK Forum was realized through models of exchange of knowledge and experience, both of experts from relevant fields, as well as lessons learned by people from practice and their own experiences, which will help the participants in their further work with minorities and vulnerable groups.

This approach has proven to be extremely rewarding and dynamic, as it includes looking at a certain issue from multiple perspectives. Through interactive approaches, the theme of art as a lever of recovery is covered, the work methodology of individual participants is presented, the basics of design thinking, and the skills that, in earlier work with the participants, proved to be necessary for their work, namely: the production of cultural and public events, relations with to the media and the public, as well as building alliances, partnerships, and advocacy, workshops on the development of sustainable finance, diversification and connecting funding sources. In addition to the above, the participants themselves transferred their skills of working with vulnerable groups, mechanisms, and work methodologies such as TRE, art therapy, and mindfulness.

CRY - crisis and creative program



As a reaction to the challenging pandemic years, the Solidarna Foundation and the Fund for Others launched a new program of financial support for the protection of mental health through artistic practice as part of Culture in the Community - CRY.



During 2022, through the CRY pilot program, we supported 15 mental health protection and affirmation programs in the form of small financial grants (10 winners), mentoring and professional support (15 winners), and targeted support in the procurement of equipment, access to other donors and networking (15 winners). Among the grant recipients are: the Association of Families of Persons with Mental Disabilities Lica duše from Split, the Association for the Development of Creative Potentials of Children, Youth, and Adults Creativity Laboratory from Slavonski Brod, Center for Rehabilitation from

Zagreb, BLOK - Local Base for Refreshing Culture from Zagreb, DKC Dokkica from Osijek, Association Kultura Nova from Zagreb, Ivana Ognjanovac from Zagreb, Empiria Theater from Zagreb, Association how are you? from Zagreb, Association for the Promotion of Mental Health Feniks from Split, Association Lifeline from Zagreb, Croatian Association of Digital Artists from Zagreb, Association of Dance Artists of Croatia UPUH from Zagreb, Student Association USBRI from Rijeka, Jelena Horvat Horvatek from Varaždin.

The projects are intended to destigmatize mental health care through art. The launch of KRIK was financially supported by Atlantic Grupa, Ginger Sushi, and Montessori Group, as well as small donations from individuals, while the Common Path Foundation and ACT Group will provide expert support for the implementation of the mentoring program.

HUMAN RIGHTS FILM FESTIVAL

The 20th edition of the Human Rights Film Festival was held from November 4 to 11, 2022 in a hybrid format, and the SOLIDARNA Foundation, as in previous years, participated in the implementation of the program. During the week of the HRFF, we organized and held three public events.

Bania living library

As part of the Human Rights Film Festival, the Bania living library program was held at the Cultural Information Center in Zagreb. On December 8, 2022, the Bania Living Library in Zagreb brought a collection of tense stories of protagonists and protagonists of the reconstruction and earthquake in Bania in a wide range of genres - from picture books and warm human stories, street art catalogs, through political thrillers, road novels and magical realism of survival.





The librarians of the Bania library are Doria Jukić (CKP POKAZ) and Marina Škrabalo (SOLIDARNA Foundation) and they introduced all the interlocutors in the role of living books and served as a guide to find their way around and instructed the audience to listen to the stories of "books" in short sessions of 20 minutes. After the interactive Bania Living Library, there was a screening of Tea Lukač's film "Roots", which captures life in Bania right before the earthquake, in all its wounds, but also human strength and socializing with local Bania products.

Mental Health in Letters, Numbers, and Lives

The Croatian Association of Mental Health Associations - SUMEZ and the SOLIDARNA Foundation, on the occasion of the adoption of the strategic and budgetary framework for the protection of mental health, organized a public discussion "Mental health in letters, numbers, and lives".

The debate was held at the Cultural Information Center (KIC), as part of the 20th Human Rights Film Festival in Zagreb. In the form of a "citizen's hour", the key issue of overcoming the pressing mental health crisis in Croatia was discussed: "How to close the gap between the pressing needs and the capacity deficit for comprehensive, effective, and timely mental health care as soon as possible through the newly adopted strategic measures and accompanying budget items does it reach all citizens in need?".

How to advocate for human rights and gain support?



As part of HRFF, the SOLIDARNA Foundation and the Fund for Active Citizenship (ACF Croatia) organized a drop-in workshop "How to advocate for human rights and gain support?" of the Fund for Active Citizenship Croatia (ACF Croatia).

The workshop is dedicated to public advocacy skills based on examples of successful advocacy actions focused on a wide spectrum of human rights protection and solving pressing social problems. At the workshop, visitors had the opportunity to get more information about the application process and project selection criteria for the permanently open Call for ACF Croatia ad-hoc action projects. The workshop was led by Marina Škrabalo from the SOLIDARNA Foundation, a member of the ACF Croatia capacity building team.

ACTIONS AND CAMPAIGNS

Enough!

After the story of Mirela Čavajda and her case reached the public, the SOLIDARNA Foundation with cooperating organizations launched a humanitarian campaign and called on citizens to help collect the necessary amount for Mirela needed for a medical procedure to terminate the pregnancy due to severe malformation of the fetus, which would be carried out in Slovenia.



Within 40h from the start of the humanitarian action 'Let's support Mirela' 220.687,31 HRK has been gathered. As a reminder, Mirela was forced to go to a hospital in a different state at her own expense to end a pregnancy due to a severe malformation of the embryo. The cost of this medical service in Slovenia amounts to 5.000 EUR. The SOLIDARNA Foundation immediately provided 15.000 HRK (2.000 EUR) and called on all fellow citizens to help



us gather the remaining 22.500 HRK (around 3.000 EUR) This target amount was surpassed multiple times over, by which the citizens clearly showed that they have had ENOUGH political games at the expense of women's health!

1472 fellow citizens and 16 legal persons **expressed their support for Mirela by donating. We** thank you all for the solidarity you showed for our fellow citizen in these difficult moments!

Before launching the humanitarian campaign, on May 6, the SOLIDARNA Foundation together with civil society organizations submitted a request for accessible, safe, and legal termination of pregnancy in Croatia in front of the Croatian Parliament and sent an open letter of support to Mirela Čavajda.

Let us all be Gabrijela's family

Foundation SOLIDARNA and Index promocija d.o.o. in October 2022, launched an action to collect funds for the living expenses and education of Gabriela K., whose parents and brother died in a traffic accident.

From October 24 to December 1, 2022, HRK 1,340,556.72 in various currencies was collected for Gabrijela. During the duration of the action, 6,092 individual donations were paid, of which 6,003 were payments by natural persons and 89 were payments by legal entities. We are very grateful to all our fellow citizens and legal entities who made it possible to help Gabriela with their support.

EASE THEIR TROUBLES: Support the procurement of energy efficiency kits for elderly people

Due to the increase in energy prices towards the end of 2022, a particularly affected group of society was older people with a worse economic condition who live in homes that are energy inefficient due to poor insulation, heating systems, or installations.



Green Energy Cooperative and the SOLIDARNA Foundation launched the campaign "Let's ease their troubles" to purchase energy-saving packages in the amount of HRK 60,000 (EUR 7,700) for 100 elderly people in the City of Zagreb and Zagreb County. Using the energy saving package, one household can annually save up to 1,300 kwh of heat and up to 370 kwh of electricity, or up to 1,600 HRK (EUR 212,00). The content of the package was the same for all users, except for a few packages that were adapted depending on the specific situation and method of energy consumption, that is, the needs of the household. Potential recipients

had to be either beneficiaries of the national allowance for the elderly, or recipients of the allowance for vulnerable energy buyers, or recipients of the guaranteed minimum allowance, or beneficiaries of a pension in the amount of HRK 2,000 (EUR 265,45) per month. The Green Energy Cooperative also provided free energy counseling to package winners. HRK 64,713.47 (EUR 8.589,00) was successfully collected. We are very grateful



for the generous donations of 178 fellow citizens and 11 legal entities that enabled the implementation of this project.

Fund for Women campaign: For equality as our reality

After 7 years of continuous work on the protection of women's rights and the promotion of gender equality **the SOLIDARNA Foundation established the Women's Fund** with four program areas – assistance to victims of domestic and sexual violence, availability of reproductive care, economic empowerment and education, prevention and advocacy.

The Croatian Women's Fund campaign was launched on November 29, 2022 and the first phase lasted until December 31, 2022 and the results exceeded all our expectations. The goal of the campaign was to present the new Fund and collect funds for its work, as well as to raise general awareness and visibility on the topic of women's rights, and the amount of positive comments and support left us truly moved. The campaign was implemented through online and offline channels throughout the country – billboards, city lights, outdoor digital advertising, radio, TV, social networks, google ads.



Stimulating campaign of the Women's Fund was born out of pure enthusiasm, and for that we are immensely grateful to our creative team, without whom the campaign would not exist, which consists of: Ira Payer (<u>Superstudio</u>), Tena Razumović Žmara i Vanja Daskalović (<u>Golden</u>), Jakov Vilović (<u>Utorak</u>) with digital support Mirte Rebrine & Eve Tetec (<u>Izone.agency</u>). Many thanks also to the photographer Nina Đurđević, who is responsible for the great photos from the presentation of the Women's Fund. **The campaign resonated**



throughout Croatia through online and offline media thanks to: <u>Go2Digial</u>, <u>Zagreb Plakat</u>, <u>PIO</u> d.o.o., RTL, Index i T-portal.

From November 29, 2022 to December 31, 2022, a total of HRK 267,020.37 (EUR 35,439.69) was paid to the giro sub-account of the Fund for Women of the SOLIDARNA Foundation. During the duration of the campaign, 151 individual donations were given, of which 141 were payments by individuals in the total amount of HRK 77,315.37 (10,261.51 EUR) and 10 payments by legal entities in the amount of HRK 189,705.00 (25,178.18 EUR). The lowest individual donation was HRK 1.00 (EUR 0.13), and the highest was HRK 100,000.00 (EUR 13,272.28), while the average donation was HRK 1,768.35 (EUR 234.7). Of the collected funds, HRK 52,041.47 (EUR 6,907.09) were spent on the implementation of the campaign, HRK 21,889.96 (EUR 2,825.66) of the collected funds were directed to organizational costs, i.e. 3% of citizens' donations, which is HRK 2,319.46 (EUR 307.85) and 10% from donations from business entities, which is HRK 18,970.50 (EUR 2,517.82).

The campaign continues throughout 2023 through public formats, and you can still invest in the Women's Fund, because a socially beneficial contribution always pays off.

PROJECTS

#YouthAgainstCyberbullying

#YouthAgainstCyberbullying is the name of a project led by the Forum for International Cooperation from Denmark and implemented in partnership with six countries - SOLIDARNA Foundation (Croatia), Development and Cooperation Initiative (Serbia), SOLIDAR (Belgium), CENTERS D'ENTRAINEMENT AUX METHODES D' EDUCATION ACTIVE (France), Arci Liguria (Italy), Alapítvány a Magyarországi Progresszív Gazdaságpolitikáért és Politikai Gazdaságtanért (Hungary). The project, with delays due to the COVID-19 pandemic, has been implemented since September 2, 2019. The goal is to raise the awareness of young people about cyberbullying in all partner countries through education and the creation of online platforms, mobile applications and educational e-brochures.

As part of the #YouthAgainstCyberbullying project in 2022, an e-brochure was created in which you can find the definition and examples of violence on the Internet, the roles that young people can take in it, advice on what to do for people who are targeted by Internet violence, parents, teachers and other personnel. The text of the brochure was prepared by Azra Ayyash from the SOLIDARNA Foundation, and it was designed by Goga Golik, a collaborator on the project.

During April, May, June and July SOLIDARNA's team has been intensely working on materials needed for Intellectual outputs website and mobile application, form videos, information, articles, translation of the website, the games, as well as the brochure. The team has researched the cyberbullying phenomenon, collected the information and knowledge gained through TA1 and feedback from frontrunners as well as participants in National training event and multiplier events.

As part of the project, 4 frontrunners from Croatia participated in TA1, acquired knowledge about cyberbullying, and acquired the skills and tools necessary to fight against online bullying, as well as to share experience and



knowledge with other young people in Croatia to raise awareness and education of young people about the problem of internet abuse and its consequences. The SOLIDARNA Foundation organized the 1st National Training in Zagreb at the First Gymnasium, for 27 young people in order to educate them about cyberbullying and open a space for exchanging experiences and hearing from young people what cyberbullying is for them, how they experience it, how they deal with it, how much is it common among them and are they aware if they are victims of online violence or when they are victims of people in their environment.



First multiplier event in cooperation with First Gymnasium Varaždin was held on 18th of May, in Varaždin. 47 high school students have participated. Second multiplier event was held on 10th of June in Petrinja in cooperation with High School Petrinja for 24 students. Third multiplier event was held on 14th of June in Pula in cooperation with Gymnasium Pula for 21 student. Overall, participants were very happy with the workshops and frontrunners approach which was based on interactive communication rather than lecturing which was proven as more beneficial and more educational this time than classic ex cathedra approach.

Overall SOLIDARNA Foundation has participated in 10 PSC meetings-4 in person and 6 online, 3 PWG meetings-2 in person, and 1 online, in TA1 in Copenhagen with 6 participants, has organized 1 National training event in Zagreb and 3 National conferences in three different geographical areas of Croatia- in Varaždin (Varazdin County), Petrinja (Sisak-Moslavina County) and Pula (Istra County). SOLIDARNA Foundation has worked on all three Intellectual outpus and has created the e-brochure and has organized final PSC meeting in Zagreb.

Health Observatory

Health Observatory is the name of the project led by the Association Krijesnica together with partner organizations, namely 11 associations (Association of Parents and Children Dravet Syndrome Croatia, Center for Healthy Growing



IDEM and I, Association of Parents in Action - RODA, Croatian Forum Against Breast Cancer - Europa Donna Croatia, Terra Association, Hrvatski Cochrane, Croatian Multiple Sclerosis Association - SDMSH, Association for Children with Developmental Disabilities Zvončići, Association of Parents for Vitally Vulnerable Children "Kolibrići", Croatian Network for Rural Development-HMRR, Coalition of Health Associations) and 2 foundations (SOLIDARNA Foundation, Nora Šitum Foundation), 4 scientific institutions (Faculty of Law, University of Zagreb, Faculty of Law, University of Rijeka, Faculty of Economics, University of Rijeka, Faculty of Medicine, University of Zagreb, School of Public Health Andrija Štampar) and 1 trade union (Independent Health Trade Union) and social welfare of Croatia). Associate members are the organization Volunteers in Palliative Care La Verna and the Croatian Association of Breastfeeding Counselors.

The project aims to **strengthen the capacity of civil society organizations** to achieve effective dialogue with public administration, social partners and scientific higher education institutions in designing and implementing reforms that contribute to equality of citizens in access to quality health care and preservation and development of public health systems.

The Health Observatory operates through **SEMAFOR** (research), **INCUBATOR** (policy innovation), **TRANSFORMATOR** (dialogue and advocacy), **GENERATOR** (stakeholder capacity building). The SOLIDARNA Foundation actively participates in all activities, and is intensively engaged in activities to strengthen the capacity of civil society organizations and activities to coordinate public campaigns and involve the public in advocacy processes. As part of its work on these activities, **the SOLIDARNA Foundation held nine workshops in 2022**, **which thematically included advocacy, health literacy, scientific production, digital marketing and fundraising**, as well as workshops on health budgeting, and workshops on joint network planning.

Advocacy and support of the SOLIDARNA Foundation

During 2022, the SOLIDARNA Foundation continued to actively support advocacy efforts aimed at protecting and promoting human rights.

The SOLIDARNA Foundation continues to work with collaborating organizations for the protection of women's human rights and fights against gender-based violence, which has been particularly evident through the activities of the #saveme Fund for Crisis Support to Victims of Domestic and Sexual Violence and the establishment of the Croatian Women's Fund at the end of the year. In the month when we celebrate #16Days of Activism, the SOLIDARNA Foundation launched the first Women's Fund in Croatia and began a campaign to present the Fund and collect funds for its work.

As in 2021 and during 2022, great advocacy efforts were directed toward the recovery of the earthquake-affected area. Due to the continuation of life in poor housing conditions, many victims are in temporary accommodation, as well as all those who are still waiting for the reconstruction of their collapsed homes, especially residents of rural and isolated areas for whom the availability of health and social services will be further hampered, on the anniversary of the earthquake the SOLIDARNA Foundation and 34 organizations sent another appeal to the authorities and called for accountability.



The press release points out that it is the last hour to take full political responsibility for the delays in the reconstruction; to immediately and significantly increase the effectiveness of public services in the reconstruction and recovery of communities in their full spectrum, from construction and housing, health and social care, through education and employment opportunities, to free legal aid and support for farmers.

It will be unfeasible without effective coordination and a central management point because effective implementation requires more people in local services, many more contractors with quality supervision, strengthening of local civil society organizations through more appropriate funding programs, more off-road vehicles, and mobile teams, real cooperation of the public with non-profit and business sectors and far less bureaucracy.

The SOLIDARNA Foundation, the associations RODA – Parents in Action, CESI and CROSOL – the platform for international civil solidarity of Croatia organized a solidarity protest rally on July 4 in Zagreb's Zrinjevac Park in response to the annulment of the Roe v. Wade verdict.



In a decision dated June 24, 2022, by a majority vote (5:4), the US Supreme Court overturned the historic ruling in the case of Roe v. Wade from 1973, which legalized abortion at the federal level. A protest rally called "Women's Independence Day", symbolically organized on the American "Independence Day" was meant to affirm



autonomy of women's bodies and choices as a core element of democracy and to showcase solidarity between women in Croatia and the millions of women in America that lost the fundamental right to a federally protected abortion and the right to privacy in such healthcare decisions.

As every year before, until the coronavirus pandemic prevented us, in 2022 we were again on street 8.3. and participated in the Women's March organized by the collaborative organization fAktiv on the occasion of International Women's Day. SOLIDARNA was also part of the Pride Parade in 2022, standing in solidarity for the safety, freedom, and pride of every person who makes up the wealth of the LGBTIQ+ community and our human race, on every street, every workplace, every school, and every home throughout Croatia and the world.

We have participated in and supported several trainings and campaigns of cooperating organizations and contributed as guests, co-organizers, activists, or educators.

Organizational achievements of SOLIDARNA in 2022.

In 2022, SOLIDARNA managed to ensure continuity of work even though since the beginning of the year there has been no predictable source of financial support for institutional development, which covers the costs of operational costs and constant professional development.

We entered the year 2022 with a new director, Ivan Blažević, former secretary of the Foundation, while Marina Škrabalo replaced her role as director with the role of program advisor and continued to actively contribute to the foundation's programmatic achievements.

In the December of 2022, the SOLIDARNA Foundation announced a call for the employment of an expert associate for finance and administration, and a new colleague was selected who will start her work at Solidarna in early 2023.

Even during 2022, the SOLIDARNA Foundation did not manage to secure a larger workspace in public rent (the City of Zagreb or the Republic of Croatia).

The work of the SOLIDARNA Foundation in 2022 was awarded with two awards. The SOLIDARNA Foundation is the **winner of the Diana Obexer Budisavljević Award** for Humanity and Justice, awarded by the Serbian National Council, which is dedicated to the principles of solidarity and humanitarianism. The Fund 5.5 project of the Solidarna Foundation is the national winner of the **European Citizen Award** for 2022, which the European Parliament recognizes for the work of civic associations, organizations, and individuals to promote understanding and strengthen European unity.

Collaborative network and SOLIDARNA volunteers

In its work, SOLIDARNA Foundation **continues to rely heavily on the volunteer work** and material contributions of donors, citizens and companies, which is its long-term strategy of mobilizing the community to protect human rights and its own sustainability. The material, logistical and program support of several organizations was also valuable: Slagalica Foundation CFS, SMART Association, #saveme initiative, Croatian Business Council for Sustainable Development, Croatian Federation of Independent Trade Unions, K-Zone, Krijesnica Association,



Coalition of Health Associations, Radio Yamat, Human Rights Film Festival Zagreb, Catalyst Balkans from Serbia and CNVOS from Slovenia.

In 2022, in addition to the constant volunteer engagement of Sanja Sarnavka, Mirjana Matešić, Boris Jokić, Zlata Pastar, and Nebojsa Taraba as members of the Foundation Board, we especially thank Biserka Tomljenović, Assoc. Ph.D. Antonija Petričušić, Jelena Kovačić Solarić and Prof. Ph.D. Dean Ajduković as members and member of the Foundation Council of the #saveme Fund, Zoran Pusić, Vesna Teršelič, Martina Horvat, and Iskra Pejić as members and member of the Foundation Council of the Desa & Jerko Baković Fund. FINANCIAL REPORT FOR 2022

In the seven year since its inception, SOLIDARNA Foundation continued the trend of revenue growth, revenue which allows us to continue working and is the wind in our sails regarding engagement around new initiatives, philanthropic programs, campaigns, the active provision of support to the most vulnerable groups in society, and the protection of human rights.

Each previous year, revenues had doubled at a steady pace, from HRK 182,347 in 2016, HRK 434,914 in 2017 and HRK 870,398 in 2018 to HRK 1,777,819 in 2019, HRK 3,329,686 in 2020, in 2021 revenues quadrupled to HRK 12,457,066.00. In 2022, year without crisis we are on HRK 4,991,050.00.

The current organizational budget is sufficient to cover core staff and operational costs of SOLIDARNA.


Revenues in 2022





through donations, namely HRK 4,845,989.00, while revenues from the sale of goods and services are in second place, namely HRK 104,530.00.
























Expenditures in 2022






























CONCLUSION

We hope that in 2023 we will continue to justify the trust you give us.

- Development of programs to support new and creative initiatives for the protection of human rights
- Development of capacity, financing, infrastructure and material support, and additional support for fundraising and advocacy
- Developing community philanthropy and advocating for a better legal and institutional framework for philanthropy in the Republic of Croatia
- Development of a culture of solidarity through education, counseling, networking and cross-sectoral partnerships
- Further consolidation of organizational procedures, digitalization of business and expansion of scope, and expansion of the competence of the executive team in line with the trend of expanding opportunities for philanthropic action
- Systematic attraction of permanent small donors to thematic funds and overall activities of SOLIDARNA Foundation
